KevanN: I had a meeting with our high school staff development committee last night and discussed the possibility of using my virtual office as a meeting place over the summer

BjB: wonderful!

KevanN: they were interested in that possibility too. **KevanN**: I will have to restock my refreshments.....

BjB: were they willing to give professional development credits? **BjB**. o O (that would be a big draw for teachers to get involved)

KevanN: CEUs would be offered and any follow up would perhaps generate a stipend from the district's allocation of funds that we are entitled to apply for, Nothing big of course

KevanN: One would think so.

BjB: doesn't have to be big. PA requires so many CEUs in a five year period to maintain certification

KevanN: The focus would probably be around reading an Educational teaching / learning text

ArthurH joined the room.

KevanN: So do we - 120 CEUs every 5 yrs

BjB: Hi, Arthur. Welcome **ArthurH**: Hi **BjB** and Kevan

KevanN: with some of the options available, the CEUs are certainly not all that rigorous

across the board **KevanN**: hi Arthur

BjB: anything we can help you with, Arthur?

BjB: yeah...if the admin is willing to accept stuff like TI participation especially!

ArthurH: How does one listen in on the calendar events or log in?

BjB: you do what you just did, Arthur **BjB**: what event were you looking for?

ArthurH: I'm looking for the art curriculum events

BjB: ahhh...Arthur, meet Kevan!

BiB: Kevan, meet Arthur

KevanN: Hi Arthur - are you here for ArtsConnected?

ArthurH: Hi Kevan,

ArthurH: Nice to meet you Kevan,

KevanN: And you, Arthur - do you have any experience with ArtsConnected yet? **ArthurH**: Kevan, yes I was interested in ArtsConnected. Thanks for finding it.

KevanN: Well, just so happens that I am the presenter for ArtsConnected here on Tapped In and a trainer for the 2 museums that it represents

ArthurH: Kevan, no I don't but I am intrigued by the name.

BjB: Arthur, I just id'd you...you are an art teacher? **KevanN**: Well, how would you like to visit the site?

BjB . o O (you also need to change your gender in your ID

Unless Arthur is a female name)

BjB stops interrupting...sorry, Kevan!

KevanN: no problem...lol.! housekeeping is almost the first priority

ArthurH: That's great, I am finishing my arts credential. By the way, I am a female but am using my son's name.

KevanN: of course, I am not much of a housekeeper...

BjB: Kevan, would you like to meet with Arthur in your office?

KevanN: sure...see you there Arthur.

BjB: Arthur, do you know how to join Kevan?

KevanN left the room.

Room: Kevan Nitzberg's Office

KevanN joined the room. ArthurH joined the room. KevanN: hi again Arthur ArthurH: Hi Kevan

KevanN: Welcome to my 'office'.

BJ joined the room.

BJ waves hi

KevanN: I have a number of files here that you can peruse at your leisure

KevanN: intros BJ? **BJ:** Please. Kevan

KevanN: ok - Arthur, how about you first?

ArthurH: ok thank-you **ArthurH**: ok, what do I do

BJ: I'm an art teacher in Pennsylvania and a helpdesk volunteer for Tapped In

BJ . o O (briefly tell what you do and where you're located, Arthur) **KevanN**: I am a high school art teacher in Minnesota and President

Elect of my state art teachers organization(. I also write for an online ezine that comes out of New Zealand that is listed on this page

KevanN: oops...stepped out of turn - my apologies

ArthurH: Yes, I'm finishing my art credential in San Diego and I'm going to teach art at a local high school.

KevanN: ahhhh...a warm climate! I am envious

KevanN: ok, a little about ArtsConnected is in order then...

BJ: As you can see, Arthur, Kevan uses his office as a resource room for ArtsConnected **ArthurH**: Well, today it is cold around 40's at night but rain prob.tomorrow.Summer's were hot during August thr.October

KevanN: this is an online, interactive learning environment that is hosted by the Mpls. Institute of Art and the Walker Art Center (we are going below 0 degrees tonight).

KevanN: Among the many features of ArtsConnected:

KevanN: you can create a publishable collection of artwork and text with links to the internet that you can share with others...

SusanR joined the room.

BJ waves hi to Sue

KevanN: you can access over 40,000 images online that have been digitized by the 2 museums...

KevanN: hi Sue!

SusanR waves to Kevan and Arthur

KevanN: you can listen to recorded conversations with artists such as Marcel DuChamp and Claes Oldenburg...

ArthurH: Thanks BJ and Kevan, art is a great resource as we do not have enough art resources in San Diego for the children.

KevanN: you can view animated short features that illustrate the elements and principles of art

ArthurH: Sorry, I'm new to Tapped in and chat rooms

KevanN: and much, much more that is all for free!

KevanN: no problem - it's all a learning experience

KevanN: How about we visit the site? Field trip anyone?

ArthurH: Thanks I think I will try viewing the Walker Art Center and Artsconnected, yes field trips are great, OK.

SusanR: I am ready!

KevanN: OK - you are taking a field trip now, Arthur...lol!

KevanN: http://www.artsconnected.org

KevanN: click on the address and then click on the Art Gallery icon and come back to the chat page

KevanN: One of the newer and exciting features on ArtsConnected is the Artists Toolkit

KevanN: You can see the icon on the right hand side of your screen

KevanN: This feature allows you to demonstrate the elements and principles of art to all age levels in a very entertaining and informative fashion. Click on the icon and you will get to a new page....

KevanN: You will need to have 'Flash' on your computer to view the animated sequences

KevanN: Everybody there?

KevanN: looks out into the office, but sees no-one stirring....perhaps the coffee put everyone to sleep...

KevanN: that's it - no more decaf

KevanN: Well, in case someone is following this mindless chatter...

BJ listens closely

KevanN: click on the Explore the Toolkit green triangle

KevanN: This brings up a series of linked elements and principles that are all connected to animated shorts. All of the shorts are attached to works of art that are at the 2 museums hosting this site

KevanN: (thanks BJ!)

KevanN: Let's try one of my favorites -

SusanR: Sorry, where's that Toolkit again (login problems)

SusanR: got it

KevanN: At the bottom of the right hand column is the selection "Repetition Makes a Pattern"

KevanN: (great, Susan!)

KevanN: Click on that once and watch the film - keep your volume turned up.

KevanN: If you are on a dial up as I am it does take a bit of patience

SusanR: wow!!

KevanN: If (as Susan obviously is), you are on a faster connection, feel free to try some additional shorts

SusanR: Do things slow down if you have a lab of kids on the site?

KevanN: not that I have found...there are other issues with networked computers though **SusanR**: Kevan, this is invaluable...great for teaching perspective, which is on our junior curriculum.

KevanN: There are a ton of applications. I am teaching a video / computer high school class, for instance, and use this site to give my art students who are in the class a refresher in E&P with a computerized slant and my computer geeks a remedial lesson in exactly what the E & P are.

KevanN: This really helps to bridge the gap in a very entertaining fashion.

KevanN: The encyclopedia section also gives you more clickable examples of artworks that help to illustrate these terms as well.

KevanN: In addition....

KevanN: 2 local MN artists are featured in 2 animated 3 min. clips creating artwork with color form pieces that help to show how a composition can be put together using simple materials

SusanR listens intently

KevanN: Shall we explore some other features on ArtsConnected?

SusanR: Yes, please.

KevanN: ...remember I only have another 1/2 hour.

KevanN: ok!

KevanN: Go back to the art gallery page and we will look around there some more...

ArthurH: I enjoyed the tour and the art gallery. Thanks Kevan

KevanN: Let's first look at the other featured icons on the

page

KevanN: Glad you liked it Arthur - more to come!

KevanN: First, are either of you familiar with these features? **SusanR**: Should we be on the Visual Elements page, Kevan

ArthurH: No, I'm not familiar with the features.

KevanN: No - on the Art Gallery page (the bust and frame icon on the main artconnected page)

SusanR: Yes, but I can use the review **KevanN**: you are in for a treat Arthur.

SusanR: I am there!

KevanN: alright then. First the box of marbles - that is the Art Collector site which allows you to create your own art collection. This is a fairly lengthy procedure but you can get information on creating the collection from the file in my office entitled Art Collector Directions...

KevanN: Next....

KevanN: Art Sampler allows you to virtually 'throw' the dice and you will come up with 10 random works of art from the 2 museums...

KevanN: Each one is clickable and will bring you to subsequent pates that allow you to read about, enlarge and zoom in on the artwork...

KevanN: Let's try that one as it is fairly short

excercise...

KevanN: Click on the dice

KevanN: each of the pictured works can be clicked on...try one and see what you come up with - an 'x' means a certain work is no longer available for viewing

KevanN: You can also click on "Choose a new group' to select 10 new works to examine

KevanN: note that there are additional functions on the page such as a word search screen and boxes that are clickable that help to expand or narrow the search

KevanN: ok...let's move on. Go to the top of the page and click on the bust and frame icon again.

SusanR: This can serve as a complete semester course!

KevanN: back on the screen is the global positioning button. This is a new feature that allows you to view contemporary artists work from around the world. Let's click on that and see what we get...

KevanN: This feature follows a show on contemporary global art that was at the Walker last year.

SusanR: I am still with you, Kevan!

KevanN: Great!

SusanR eagerly listens

KevanN: Move one of the icons into the red square and see what happens.

KevanN: The map shifts position in accordance with selection

made

SusanR: This is quite unique, Kevan.

KevanN: A variety of choices are made available to you to further

KevanN: Yes it is! Sound files are available through some of these selections as well.

KevanN: ok...time to move to another feature...

SusanR explores and experiments

KevanN: back to the art gallery page again....this time scroll all the way down to the bottom of the features...

KevanN: and click on more adventures....then click to the bottom of that screen...

KevanN: ...and click on the reworked page, World Myths and Legends

KevanN: This has become a very user friendly site for teachers and students

KevanN: ...for example

KevanN: click on What is a Myth...

SusanR notices the glossary and downloadable curriculum

KevanN: yes - there is that too!

KevanN: the definition of myth is quite comprehensive and makes the rest of the site that much clearer in terms of what is being looked at

KevanN: ...another great feature is Compare and Contrast - click on it

KevanN: This allow a student (or whole class) to explore the concept of comparing and contrasting works of art and writing their answers online.

KevanN: The answers are then printable / collectable / gradable - whatever direction you wish to follow.

KevanN: Try doing your own compare and contrast now.

SusanR: Can students save their essays within the site?

KevanN: Not on this page - that is a function of art collector

SusanR . o O (Safari is not allowing me use the check boxes.)

KevanN: However, images can be copied and pasted onto a Word document and the writing copy and pasted as well.

KevanN: I am on Microsoft Explorer. I am not familiar with Safari.

KevanN: This is also doable on Netscape Navigator

SusanR: Thank you Kevan. I will try later in Explorer.

KevanN: There might be a way around the Safari snafu - I will have to ask the Tech folks at the museum of they are familiar with the situation.

KevanN: If you are interested in looking at artwork from a multicultural perspective...

KevanN: click on Explore Art by Culture...

SusanR: yes..

KevanN: This groups the artwork into cultural categories for further examination / comparison / discussion

KevanN: Clicking on the artwork that comes up gives you a wide range of discussion topics and key ideas to explore

KevanN: Art by Theme is yet another focus worth examining

SusanR: One can enlarge the image and get additional info...like the idea of discussion questions

KevanN: I particularly like the Creation Myths as they really help to present to students a wide range of belief systems

KevanN: ...in very comprehensive contexts

SusanR looks at the creation myths

KevanN: Well, that's all I have time for tonight folks. Hope that this was as informative and fun for you as it ALWAYS is for me!

KevanN: Till the next time then.... **SusanR**: very comprehensive, Kevan

BJ: Thanks, Kevan! **KevanN**: goodnight!

KevanN: you are most welcome! **SusanR**: Thank you for the overview

KevanN: my pleasure

KevanN: Check out the files in my office for more info if you haven't already.
