**JohnF** joined the room.

**KeikoS:** Hi, John sensei, meet Kumahata sensei

**KumaGst6:** kon nichiya

**JohnF:** Konnichiwa

**KumaGst6:** yoroshiku

**KumaGst6:** onegaisimasu

**JohnF:** I met you at SOCALLT in Arlington earlier this year.

**KumaGst6:** oh, yeah, how have you been?

**JohnF:** Great and busy and you?

**KumaGst6:** me 2, now speaking of SOCALLT it is in Houston this year Feb. 6-7. little advertisement!

**KumaGst6:** anyone from Louisiana, Arkansas, Oklahoma, Colorado, New Mexico, and Texas can come.

**JohnF:** I hope I can make it but it is far for us out west here.

**KumaGst6:** I hope you can, today is the deadline for the abstract. are you going to send one in?

**JohnF:** I don't think I'll make it for today's deadline but I'd like to see the other presentations

**JohnF:** FLEAT V will be in Salt Lake in 2005

**KumaGst6:** in conjunction with IALLT

**JohnF:** I hope to go.

**KumaGst6:** me 2

**KeikoS:** Have we all met?

**KumaGst6:** I have not met bjb yet

**KeikoS:** BJB is our community leader. She teaches art in juvenile facility.

**KeikoS:** She is from PA.

**KeikoS** bows to BJB

**KeikoS:** If we all know each other, I like Kumahata sensei to summarize some of his points.

**KumaGst6:** sure,

**KeikoS:** We can informally go into Q&A when we feel is good...

**KeikoS** smiles and bows.

**PeterGst2** joined the room.

**KeikoS:** Oh, Peter made it.

**KumaGst6:** all the technology is really started to help teachers

**PeterGst2:** Hey it worked

**KeikoS:** I am Keiko Schneider, the organizer of the event. Kumahata sensei is the presenter and John F works at UTEP.

**KumaGst6:** hi Peter

**JohnF:** Hi

**PeterGst2:** HI

**KumaGst6:** anyway,

**KumaGst6:** we have a lot more to offer than just teaching through text book

**KumaGst6:** in fact, if you look at your students, they are spending a lot of time on computer communicating with each other and with strangers

**PeterGst2:** like us?

**KeikoS** grins

**KumaGst6:** this is getting more and more true with in coming freshman

**KumaGst6:** anyway,

**KumaGst6:** why don't we try to focus in their world while teaching?

**KeikoS:** OK...

**KumaGst6:** they will be more interested if they can learn in the environment

**KumaGst6:** do I need to stop??

**KeikoS:** Well, this is such a small group, we can do informally.

**PeterGst2:** keep going

**KumaGst6:** ok,

**KeikoS:** Whatever you feel, and Peter, could you quickly intro yourself?

**PeterGst2:** yes, I am Peter from UGA. I'm a grad student in Instructional Technology with some interest and background in SLA

**JohnF:** Is that University of Georgia?

**KeikoS:** Wonderful! Welcome, Peter!

**PeterGst2:** yes, I'm sorry.

**KumaGst6:** go bulldogs!

**PeterGst2:** that's right

**JohnF:** Is that the Athens campus?

**PeterGst2:** yes

**KeikoS:** Kumahata sensei, you were saying...

**KumaGst6:** I was saying that I became interested in bbs, bulletin board service, aka forum

**KumaGst6:** has anyone used it before?

**KeikoS** raises her hand, with my ESL

**KumaGst6:** thank you Keiko sensei

**KumaGst6:** but then I thought communicating in reading and writing only can be a bit boring

**PeterGst2:** as an l2 student I have used forms but not bbs

**JohnF:** Not for teaching language, yet.

**KumaGst6:** so I like using bbs with features like url or image embedding

**PeterGst2:** forums

**KumaGst6:** I would like to show you a few examples

**KumaGst6:** try <http://www.kumahata.com/BB/>

**KumaGst6:** there is a benkyo kai forum

**KeikoS:** That is a hyperlink and you can click.

**KeikoS:** Should I need to register to see what is going on?  
**PeterGst2:** same question  
**KumaGst6:** can you guys type in Japanese?  
**KumaGst6:** no you need not to register  
**PeterGst2:** nope  
**JohnF:** yes  
**PeterGst2:** Spanish, Portuguese and English. nihongo warakimasen **KumaGst6:** lol  
**KeikoS:** Wow, you can customize like this!  
**KumaGst6:** if you can go to benkyo kai forum, click on hello benkyo kai thread and just reply whatever, for me.  
**KeikoS:** phpbbs, right?  
**KumaGst6:** yes I love playing around with stuff like this, well it's my job  
**JohnF:** Is that the same as Sensei online forum?  
**KumaGst6:** after you post, click on refresh button, you will hopefully see other posts  
**KumaGst6:** you can use any language since it is coded as utf-8, unicode  
**KeikoS:** Oops, I have to adjust my view.  
**KumaGst6:** sorry  
**KeikoS:** Oops, I am probably not doing unicode.  
**KeikoS:** URGH  
**KeikoS:** I took an online class where we had over 1000 posts in 6 weeks. I guess this interface is OK for smaller traffic.  
**KeikoS:** like in language classes.  
**PeterGst2:** what about class management?  
**PeterGst2:** like calendar and assignment submission, etc.  
**KumaGst6:** hmm... someone's Japanese did not show up  
**KumaGst6:** this is not to replace webct or blackboard  
**JohnF:** How do I post a message there?  
**KumaGst6:** John, did you get in to benkyo kai forum?  
**KeikoS:** That was mine. OSX. But my default font is set to Osaka. I don't think I am sending messages in unicode either...  
**KumaGst6:** there is a new topic button at the top  
**JohnF:** I found Sensei Online forum but not Benkyou Kai.  
**PeterGst2:** ok, but they have these features (discussion), so why use phpBB as well?  
**KumaGst6:** ok john, do you see kanji under sensei on line forum? click on that  
**KeikoS:** Interface is clean and I guess it is highly customizable.  
**JohnF:** Yes, Sorry  
**KumaGst6:** Peter, not everyone has webct and blackboard number one  
**PeterGst2:** yes  
**PeterGst2:** and phpBB is free and fairly ubiquitous  
**KumaGst6:** number two, depending on the version, they do not support Japanese  
**JohnF:** I see posted messages but how do I reply.  
**PeterGst2:** have your tried Nicenet.org?  
**KeikoS:** Peter, I don't know if Japanese goes through...  
**PeterGst2:** it has class management, is free, has no ads and has discussion threads  
**KumaGst6:** John, click on any topic you will see a button at the top to reply **KumaGst6:**  
**Peter,** I have not used nicenet.org

**KeikoS:** Maybe with unicode it might...

**PeterGst2:** I don't mean to play the devil's advocate. I'm actually researching and promoting forum use (including phpBB) right now. I just want to hear your reasoning for choosing this forum

**KeikoS:** But that is more like course management system.

**KumaGst6:** Keiko sensei, I bet you are using internet explorer. that is why the character is not coming out

**KeikoS:** Oh, that is why???

**KeikoS** growls

**KumaGst6:** Keiko sensei, please use Netscape, Safari, or Opera, sorry ....

**KumaGst6:** Peter,

**KeikoS:** OK, Keiko will try it then.

**PeterGst2:** yes

**KumaGst6:** sorry, Peter, I like phpbb, because it is free, and customizable, I can include images, links, etc

**KumaGst6:** this is secret, but we also find webct is too difficult for some faculty to use

**PeterGst2:** great. Actually, of all the customizable free stuff, it's my personal favorite in most aspects as well

**PeterGst2:** I'm a php guy, too, so maybe I'm biased

**PeterGst2:** you know, free stuff

**KumaGst6:** opensource is goooooood

**PeterGst2:** that's secret!

**JohnF:** I am also using IE on OSX and have mojibake when I input

**PeterGst2:** email is too difficult for some faculty to use!

**PeterGst2:** no offense meant, please

**KeikoS** nods and understands

**KumaGst6:** no offense taken

**KeikoS:** It worked this time.

**KeikoS** . o O ( strange IE and unicode... )

**KumaGst6:** John, yes, ie and osx don't mix well on phpbb with unicode

**PeterGst2:** have you had success using online forums in your classes?

**PeterGst2:** how many classes have you used it with?

**PeterGst2:** for how long?

**PeterGst2:** I'm curious to know how things go.

**KumaGst6:** yes Peter, I supported 20 classes this semester and they all worked well

**PeterGst2:** How do you use it, etc?

**PeterGst2:** I'll shut up now.

**KeikoS:** What were the objectives for the classes?

**PeterGst2:** ditto

**KumaGst6:** we used, simplified Chinese traditional Chinese, English French, German, and Spanish

**KumaGst6:** they used it entire semester.

**JohnF:** I have been using ichat on OSX with a friend in Tokyo works great with full video & sound. Might be good for class to class communication.

**KumaGst6:** some faculty used it as synchronous tool in the lab. the teacher would post a few topics ahead and students jumped in

**KumaGst6:** John, the problem is the bandwidth.

**KeikoS:** I wondered why you used a tool that is meant for asynchro while synchro tool is out here.

**PeterGst2:** ditto

**KumaGst6:** two people can communicate well, but when you have 30 students doing it, it becomes a mess

**KeikoS:** Don't know about multilingual part, tho.

**PeterGst2:** good point

**PeterGst2:** what level L2?

**KumaGst6:** the reason we used bbs as synchronous ... a lot of reasons, security, cost, flexibility

**KeikoS** nods

**KumaGst6:** if we use bbs, then we only need to implement one tool.

**KeikoS:** Isn't it kind of odd?

**KumaGst6:** what's odd?

**KeikoS:** I guess there is a fine line async and synch, even here...

**KumaGst6:** yes, time is a strange thing

**KeikoS:** What I mean is async is not very async and synch is not too sync at times...

**KumaGst6:** I am still reading Peter's post from about 2 min ago and trying to answer some

**KeikoS** will shut up now

**KumaGst6:** no, don't shut up, but this is reality.

**KumaGst6:** that is one of my points

**KumaGst6:** this is reality now.

**KeikoS** contemplates deeply

**KumaGst6:** we used to use this stuff as simulation but no longer simulation this is their life

**KumaGst6:** and our life

**PeterGst2:** I'm not sure what you mean by simulation

**PeterGst2:** do you mean as "authentic tasks", imitating reality, but not with real intent?

**KeikoS:** I guess what I meant about odd was if it is cumbersome to have synch conversation using async tool, interface wise...

**KumaGst6:** I could not think of the term ...

**KumaGst6:** Peter, I mean like virtual reality.

**PeterGst2:** Only now they [students] sort of live this reality anyway, so it's no longer a simulation?

**PeterGst2:** ok

**KumaGst6:** Peter you got it.

**KumaGst6:** Keiko san, yes, you are right

**KumaGst6:** it is awkward (sp?)

**KeikoS:** Humm

**KumaGst6:** but when we do it with the students, they can not stop typing.

**PeterGst2:** I'm still interested in the L2 level, if possible.

**KumaGst6:** I have to kick them out to the lab

**PeterGst2:** how many students? roughly

**KumaGst6:** they want more!

**PeterGst2:** what university?

**KeikoS:** How interesting!

**KumaGst6:** our lab holds 20 students

**KeikoS:** Oh, Peter there is a paper he put out for this forum, too. Do you have the URL?

**PeterGst2:** no, I'm sorry.

**KeikoS:** I mean event...

**PeterGst2:** what is it?

**KeikoS:** <http://www.kumahata.com/edu/sol.html>

**PeterGst2:** my friend just told me about this forum.

**PeterGst2:** event

**KeikoS** chuckles

**KumaGst6:** although, let me share some bad points

**KeikoS** is eager to hear that, too

**PeterGst2:** sorry if I ask questions answered in the paper. If so, just say, 'that's in the paper' and I'll read it later. That way we can devote our time to moving on.

**KumaGst6:** heritage speakers tend not to like read too much, this happened in Chinese class they think reading is too hard

**KeikoS:** Wow, interesting point.

**KumaGst6:** Kalamazoo students did a communication project with students in Japan.

**KumaGst6:** in there, I think they thought the reading was a lot too.

**KeikoS** nods solemnly

**KeikoS:** Anything else???

**KumaGst6:** if you go back to <http://www.kumahata.com/BB> and read

**KumaGst6:** cross cultural communication/ group1 forum, you can tell it is a lot to read

**KeikoS:** Oh, wow, I can get to read it...

**PeterGst2:** what happened to John?

**KumaGst6:** I just opened it for you guys

**KeikoS:** I guess we need to have focus

**KeikoS:** It is easier to get distracted with technical details and fun.

**KumaGst6:** to use bbs effectively, (and since I moderated Kalamazoo Tokyo project it is my fault) we need to pay close attention

**KumaGst6:** we also need not to just stay in read and write, but we need to expand to listening and speaking

**PeterGst2:** Did you delete some messages? There doesn't seem to be much in group 1

**KumaGst6:** as you saw on my bbs, Arnold's Japanese commercial, stuff like this or the link to my audio, can be used as part of listening.

**KumaGst6:** Peter, could you see 12 threads?

**KumaGst6:** that was all, this bbs was not used entire semester, but probably just one month

**KeikoS:** link to audio is good...

**KumaGst6:** just let you know, wimba makes voice board, voiced bbs. we are looking into that.

**KumaGst6:** also, flash communication server is good.

**KumaGst6:** they can do a lot with video, voice, etc

**KeikoS:** lots of potentials!

**KumaGst6:** yes, a lot of it.

**KumaGst6:** sorry to have kept you until now, it is way over the time limit I get

**KeikoS:** Well, I wonder if anybody has one final question or comment...

**KeikoS:** That is OK, we had a later start. Thank you for sticking around...

**KumaGst6:** Peter, good luck with your study, and John see you at SOCALL, Keiko sensei, you are invited to SOCALLT too

**KeikoS:** Of course, I will check it out.

**PeterGst2:** thank you. Or do I say, arigato

**KumaGst6:** doo itashi mashite

**KeikoS:** Thank you very much for your presentation!

**KeikoS** claps loudly

**KeikoS:** And Peter and John, thank you for your participation

**KeikoS:** Thank you

**KeikoS** waves

**KeikoS:** Great to see you here.

**KeikoS:** Thanks for coming John sensei...
