GaladrielC: Wow! That sounds like it has the potential to be very intense, but also extremely rewarding.

BJB2: I lead these Arts and [literacy]... sessions once a month, attempting to help educators use the arts across the curriculum

GaladrielC: How do your students initially respond to art?

GaladrielC: That's what grabbed my attention - using arts across the curriculum!

BJB2: they're all required to take my class...so some are interested from the beginning and some I have to sweet talk

BJB2: I've taught at the facility for 22 years and enjoy it very much

BJB2: we're kind of doing introductions, Sue

GaladrielC: Hi Sue. BJB - have you seen changes in your students over the years?

BJB2: most of the students end up enjoying the class, experience success and learn a couple things along the way

BJB2: and we have a LOT of mental health issues

SusanR: I am a K to 3 occasional teacher and K to 3+ Great resources facilitator here at tapped in

GaladrielC: I was answering a reference question about disabilities in the US the other day, and the statistics definitely match what you've observed regarding mental health

issues. Of the roughly 6% of the US population between ages 5 and 15 with a disability, 46% have a mental illness.
