ElizabetMa: Neither do I

BJB2: if/when Karen shows you a url, please make sure you hold down the ctrl key on your keyboard when you click...or turn off pop up blockers

HinaM: thank you

TaffanieJ: okay

CarolinaD: Unfortunately, I do not know any.

MariaDC: ok

ElizabetMa: ok thanks

ThaihoaH: ok

MiguelG: got it

SilviaR: Thanks!

CarolinaD: Thank you.

KarenL: Okay, I'm going to start with BJ's suggestion. She sent me a wonderful website on student publishing. BJ, would you please be so kind as to display that url again? Please?

BJB2 looks for the url

MaryG: unfortunately I do not know any websites for student publishing, but I am looking forward to learning about a few

MariaM: Ok...My name is Maria Milan and I'm in Houston, TX currently doing my student teaching at North Shore Elementary. I hope to one day teach second grade...

BJB2 checks to see if everyone got the url

ThaihoaH: I turned off the popup blocked but I still cannot get to the site

ElizabetMa: no I didn't

BJB2: remember to hold down the ctrl key when you click on the url <u>http://www.shambles.net/pages/learning/ict/studpub/</u>

ThaihoaH: I also hit the ctrl key, but it does not work

MaryG: I got it. I have a list of websites

TaffanieJ: same here

ElizabetMa: Thanks I got it

BJB2: if you can't open the url, then go to Actions, select Send to Pasteboard, copy the url and paste it into a new browser window

SilviaR: My fourth grade students are writing a chapter book and this website is going to help me a lot.

BJB2: you can also wait and check out the url when you get your transcript

MelissaL: Your students are ready for a chapter book? I'm in fourth grade and still working on paragraphs! That's great

SilviaR: In recess, instead of playing they write.

BJB2: there is a list of about 30 sites on that url I shared

ThaihoaH: My first grader reads Junie B Jones :)

CarolinaD: I see they are passionate about writing.

SilviaR: They are in 4th grade vanguard.

MaryG: yes, thank you.

BJB2: how about if you take about 5 minutes and review them...

MiguelG: sounds good

AndreaR: sounds great

RoxanneDM: ok

BJB2: then come back and we can look at the ones you find interesting

TaffanieJ: ok

MariaM: ok

ElizabetMa: ok

HinaM: ok thank you

MariaDC: This would be a great website for my 4th grade students. They get excited by only viewing and reading each others work on the bulletin board.

ThaihoaH: education project Asia?

ThaihoaH: I have no idea how shambles site came to that Asia site

MiguelG: the amazing site is very inspiring

ThaihoaH: amazing kids site is goood

HinaM: I like the amazing kids site...the story about the little girl with the toy closet was wonderful

RoxanneDM: wow cyberkids is pretty cool, art that was submitted is really good

MaryG: FanFiction A place where students can publish (post) their writing

MaryG: Fan Fiction seems like a great website that encourages writing as well as reading. Students publish their ideas and writing and others to be read and reviewed by others.

AndreaR: I am actually enjoying the Stone Soup website. IT would be a great way to help students become interested in writing.

ElizabetMa: I like carbonmade it displays students' art work

ElizabetMa: Agree with you Carolina

MariaDC: ebooks for kids is a great site because students get a chance to write books for other children as well.

RoxanneDM: I love creative writing, and these sites are really great

ElizabetMa: Art is a great way for students to express themselves

AndreaR: I agree!

RabiyaA: these are some great websites!

BJB2: I also like the 10 tips

MariaM: I agree with several of you...I went into cyberkids and amazing kids and I loved them...

ThaihoaH: cyberkids is cute

SilviaR: In Genre Range link the students can have fun with tongue twister and making their own comic books. The illustrations are great and they can print out their very own comic book.

NicoleAA: What is the cyberkids website?

MaryG: The online magazine is a neat website too, I think it is great that it is a magazine made strictly by students. Yes, Thai, cyberkids is too cute!!

KarenL: Thanks, BJ for sharing this site. It seems to me like a wonderful resource for all types of student publishing.

MariaM: I agree with Miguel...not only through cyberkids can children share their work but also through the other websites

LindsayK: My kids would love to make a comic book, I'll have to check that one out

RoxanneDM: I like cyberkids because it doesn't require you to subscribe to anything

MariaM: I also see how several subjects can be integrated by using these websites besides students will be amazed with it

RoxanneDM: They could look at the pictures on the website drawn by other kids and make stories of their own out of them

HinaM: and this is a fun and colorful way for them to showcase their work

MariaDC: It would be cool to use it this upcoming month w/ upper grade levels to

publish their opinions on the upcoming elections

CarolinaD: A good website that children can use to make comic stips is the following, <u>www.makebeliefscomix.com/</u>

MariaM: By using cyberkids students will know how much their work is worth and appreciated by others...and the best thing about it is that everyone will have the opportunity to post something

AndreaR: Sadly, we are unable to speak of the elections at our school.

MiguelG: yeah, that project poster site is cool

MariaDC: that's true

MiguelG: that's a great idea Maria

LindsayK: Thanks Carolina, I think my kids would really enjoy that comic website

RabiyaA: yea

MiguelG: it's relevant for sure

MariaDC: thanks Miguel

KarenL: so which project are you going to work on to get students writing?

MiguelG: I'm seriously going to start publishing student work online

NicoleAA: Thank you for the website. I have it up now

ThaihoaH: I think my 1st graders would love to do this. They would require a lot of help though.

RabiyaA: I agree

ThaihoaH: It would be so exciting for them to see their work online!

MelissaL: I'm teaching 4th grade. I gave my students each a piece of gum (not allowed in school, but I got permission) then they chewed it. They made a list of everything they could possibly write about with gum. Then they started writing and loved it. Just an idea

TravisPa: merlynspen is awesome!

BJB2: Kathy Schrock recently posted a site about journaling that might lead you in another direction. The site is Penzu <u>http://penzu.com/features</u>

AndreaR: I think I would enjoy the Stone Soup with my students.

TaffanieJ: I think I would like for my students to work on the Stone Soup one because kids love poetry

MariaDC: I would do the same as Miguel, but I would like to navigate the website in more depth so I can see which site would be appropriate to begin with

NicoleAA: I like the comic book idea especially for the children that are into superheroes

SilviaR: A great topic for any age would be what they want to be when they grow up and why?

TravisPa: I don't think any of our language arts teachers are utilizing any of these.

RabiyaA: that's a good idea

MiguelG: Karen, how often do you think would be good to publish student work?

BJB2: and another option is to create a K-12 Classroom in Tapped In and have your children post to the discussion board...that would be a safe place for kids to publish on the web

ThaihoaH: that's a good site, but merlyn's pen is more geared towards older students. my students would benefit from the creative sites and stuff

ElizabetMa: I think I will like to start with the comic strip I agree with Nicole kids like superheroes

ThaihoaH: yea, our ELA teachers do not use technology a lot in the classroom

MaryG: I am going to start publishing my students' work online for sure. I like a lot of the different websites but I think kidspub might be best to start with.

RoxanneDM: I like the idea of using an online journal

MariaM: I think that something else students can write about would be either a poem or a short paragraph about themselves

MariaDC: the journal website would be a great for a language arts workstation

RabiyaA: I don't think they are aware of these cool sites

ElizabetMa: yes BJB that will be a great idea

HinaM: mine either...the only technology I have seen is in math

SilviaR: Great idea, but Is it free... K-12 Classroom, and what are the requirements. Does it take place during school hours because not all students have computer at home.

KarenL: comic strips are a good starting point. I know several students who draw characters taken from a comic strip.

BJB2: yes, the Tapped In K-12 Student Campus is free!

BJB2: and so is MakeBeliefComics

AndreaR: I think I will implement comic strips; that is a great idea to help students appreciate writing.

CarolinaD: I have third graders and a great topic for them would be about what they are passionate about. I learned today that one of my students is a gymnast and wants to try out for the Olympics.

MariaM: In my school there's only a few technology resources that teachers actually use...technology is only used when students go to the computer lab

LindsayK: Do you give the students a topic for the comics, or do you let them do their own thing?

MiguelG: students can be grouped according to their interests

BJB2 agrees with Andrea

NicoleAA: When you comic strips students also learn about dialoguing which makes their writing more interesting.

CarolinaD: I like the journal website idea as a workstation.

MariaM: I agree with Nicole

BJB2: oh, cool idea, Carolina!

TravisPa: I may introduce these websites to language department soon

MariaDC: Wow Miguel, you're really coming up with good ideas.

AndreaR: Actually, many of these websites would work great with work stations.

RabiyaA: yea as one of the workstation

MiguelG: I agree with Nicole. That's a great way to practice the concept of dialogue

RabiyaA: that's a good idea

RoxanneDM: yes i agree

TaffanieJ: I am definitely bookmarking this page

MaryG: yes, but some of my students may go a little crazy with comic ideas, violent and too detailed

AndreaR: I would just set guidelines and expectations.

KarenL: cool!!! I love how you all are sharing and brainstorming. Do more!

LindsayK: That's what I was thinking. We would definitely have to have guidelines

ElizabetMa: give them guidelines

CarolinaD: For the comics, maybe having them express the way they feel. The site has characters with emotions and they can make a story about it.

HinaM: I agree it would be a good idea to have it as a workstation, but my first graders would need some help navigating the website

MariaM: Definitely

MariaDC: A Publishing after school program would be great also for those who are interested because sometimes there may not be enough time for all the students during school hours

ThaihoaH: workstations is a great idea but my students need a lot of help and motivation.

SilviaR: True...Mary. you should definitely supervise what they write down.

MelissaL: Lindsay, create your own example for them

TravisPa: These websites would definitely get students to writing.

MariaM: Before starting any activity there should be guidelines to follow

RoxanneDM: yes, but it's a great way for them to become familiar with a computer

ThaihoaH: they get mad when they cannot spell words. Currently they are using 3 letter words

MariaDC: I know in my classroom there only 2 computers

KarenL: yep, and perhaps some keyboarding skills, too.

LindsayK: Good idea

NicoleAA: I agree with Mary and Silva

KarenL: good point. . .

ThaihoaH: My students have not even used the computer yet this year

MariaM: that is true

HinaM: mine either

KarenL: and student release forms to complete. . .

TaffanieJ: I agree with Mary that you need to give them guidelines to follow

MelissaL: They shouldn't focus on spelling if you are looking for them to write

MiguelG: we go to the comp lab for 45 min every week

MelissaL: It all depends on what aspect you want them to focus on

ElizabetMa: that's true Melissa

TravisPa: our 6th and 7th grade exploratory keyboarding classes could use these websites, right?

MariaM: It sure does

HinaM: it is always a good idea for the teacher to create a model so the students know what to expect and do

ThaihoaH: I know if I mentioned this to my teacher, she would say" great idea! but we have no time.:

ThaihoaH makes a sad face

MaryG: We have six computers and they use technology a lot. I think that you would need to do comics in small group maybe.

NicoleAA: My students are using the computer but it is more like a supervisory directive

rather than student centered learning

RabiyaA: yea time is always an issue

MariaM: Modeling is always something recommended to do for a new activity

ThaihoaH: Mary, what grade are your students?

RoxanneDM: we go to the computer lab twice a week for at least 25min

AndreaR: I completely agree with Thaihoa. These are great ideas, but sometimes it seems there is no time in the day.

MaryG: 3rd

KarenL: why would she say Thaihoa?

TaffanieJ: We only have 3 computers in our classroom

LindsayK: I think that fitting these ideas into centers would make it much easier to accomplish

HinaM: I only have one computer in my classroom for student use

KarenL: Okay, take turns. . .

MiguelG: rotate

HinaM: but the teacher does not allow the students to use it often

KarenL: make sure students have their work ready to type...

MariaM: use it as a center

CarolinaD: Maybe have a schedule in which all the students will have the opportunity using the computers.

MelissaL: do you have a mobile lab?

MiguelG: hand write the drafts and then transfer it to the comp

KarenL: oh dear. . .that is a problem. . .

RoxanneDM: yes, centers are great, everyday they change for my kindergartners, and they do work with computer programs

RabiyaA: schedule is a good idea

ThaihoaH: My kids cannot type yet. I don't mean to be so negative

TaffanieJ: sometimes, only the students who finished their work on time first will be able to use them

ElizabetMa: Centers will work if you have few computers

RabiyaA: yea

AndreaR: I would send home a keyboard sheet for students to begin to practice typing.

HinaM: that's a good idea

BJB2: kids are very motivated when they get to be big shots and type on the computer

MariaDC: Before presenting it to your teacher, I would recommend to inform yourself with the requirements for the website. This way the teacher doesn't feel overwhelmed, since they usually have a lot of things going on already

MiguelG: good point

ElizabetMa: great idea Andrea

TravisPa: As a counselor, how can I get students to write in their spare time using these websites?

CarolinaD: That's a great idea Andrea, that way they will be more familiar where all the keys are.

MiguelG: I didn't even think about typing skills

MariaDC: Good idea Andrea!!!

MaryG: yes definitely, computers tend to motivate students to think and work harder.

MariaM: I agree with Andrea since in the classroom there is almost never time for extra things...

TravisPa : I may be able to create a competition

HinaM: or maybe even during a classroom workstation the teacher can put out old keyboards so that the students get familiar with typing the keys

MiguelG: it seems that a good option would be an after-school program

ThaihoaH: I like the keyboard sheet idea

RabiyaA: good idea Hina

ThaihoaH smiles

MariaDC: I agree w/ Miguel!!!

BJB2: Travis, you could collaborate with the language arts teacher

SilviaR: Travis what about having a pen pal so they can have someone to talk to.

MiguelG: nice idea Silvia!

CarolinaD: Great idea Silvia.

KarenL: but if these assignments align with your writing state standards, this would not be extra assignments. It would be teaching to achieve your standards.

TravisPa: yeah!

MiguelG: that's true..it would just have to be very well managed

NicoleAA: I agree with Karen

ThaihoaH: pen pals are a great way to incorporate writing skills and typing skills

CarolinaD: We have reading buddies at our school, and I did not think about pen pals.

ThaihoaH: It motivates the students to write because of their new friend

AndreaR: Pen pals are a great way to motivate children. I loved my pen pal when I was younger.

MaryG: I agree with Miguel too. That would be great to start a writing club after school and they could work on their writing on a computer after school.

HinaM: I like that idea

ElizabetMa: Did you keep in contact Andrea with your pen pal

NicoleAA: Especially if students pen pals are in another city or state. You can tie social studies in and integrate the subjects.

MariaM: I like the writing club idea

AndreaR: Actually for about a year I did....

MiguelG: I remember having a pen-pal in 4th grade. it was the coolest thing

TravisPa: Do you think I might be able to create an 18 week class using these websites? This would be an elective class.

MelissaL: find another teacher you know to work with

BJB2: for students or teachers, Travis?

CarolinaD: Good suggestion Melissa.

RoxanneDM: I remember having a pen pal too, and they were in a few grades up from me, it was like a big sister thing

TravisPa: for 6th or 7th grade students.

MaryG: Good question BJB- I think one for teachers would be helpful too

BJB2: what would be the point, Travis? To try out different sites?

MelissaL: We wrote business letters to places in VA and the students actually received things back from the places

MariaM: I remember having a pen pal in 4th grade and I kept in touch with her all the way until high school

ThaihoaH: Pen Pals are fun. But back in the day, we used pen and paper and snail mail

AndreaR: That's a great social studies lesson also to incorporate with the business letters.

ThaihoaH: Yea :)

RabiyaA: yea

TravisPa: webswite/technology usage?

CarolinaD: I agree.

ElizabetMa: agree

HinaM: I agree

MariaM: I agree

NicoleAA: I agree

MariaDC: Teachers should begin one as well, that way they become familiar with it

KarenL: true. . .

MiguelG: good point Maria

BJB2: maybe team up kids to 'test' different sites, Travis

BJB2: and 'publish' their findings

NicoleAA: That would be a great idea BJ! That helps you at the same time

MariaDC: Thanks Miguel

MaryG: I agree, yes there are a lot of teachers not familiar with technology and you wonder why some schools do not integrate technology.

TaffanieJ: that's true

RoxanneDM: true

RabiyaA: yea

RabiyaA: Kids love being on the computer

TravisPa: true. thanks BJ

CarolinaD: I have noticed that too Rabiya.

MariaM: I agree with Mary G...in my school teachers have to go through some training to learn things that some of us already know...

SilviaR: Do students get paid for publishing their work?

BJB2. o O (we're shooting ourselves in the foot if we deny that kids are 'born digital')

RabiyaA smiles

MariaDC: Good question Silvia

ElizabetMa: technology is advancing and we need to keep updated with the new trends

MariaM: I agree

HinaM: that's true

AndreaR: true

ThaihoaH: I agree

MiguelG: most definitely

RoxanneDM: yes

TravisPa: I suggested in my class that teachers could create a "each one, teach one" on technology integration

MariaDC: very true

MaryG: yes, most definitely!

MiguelG: children learn differently these days

CarolinaD: Well, today they seem to have more opportunities to be exposed with new technology.

AndreaR: How would that work Travis, if I may ask?

NicoleAA: When you think about it were tech savvy too. We shouldn't be afraid to use computers into our classrooms

MariaM: every child is different with different needs

BJB2 nods to Maria

MariaM: Thanks

ThaihoaH: We need to create lessons to cater to all of the students' different needs

CarolinaD: I agree as well.

TravisPa: Andrea, The teachers that are technology savvy should teach another teacher to use that technology.

RoxanneDM: I like that idea, having a buddy

MariaDC: I agree, it may require baby steps, but it can be done!

RoxanneDM: that's what it's all about, teamwork!

MariaM: Older students can always help the younger ones learn what they already went through

HinaM: that also reinforces what they already know

TravisPa: Having a teacher technology pizza party could get the teachers there to be exposed to different technology integration techniques

ThaihoaH: yea, teaching helps strengthen their knowledge and gives them a confidence boost

RabiyaA: that's a good idea...teachers need to be more supportive of this idea
