SusanR: I am from Ottawa, Ontario, Canada. I facilitate the K to 3+ Great Resources sessions here

BJB2 nudges Johnathan...you awake?

FrancescLS: what is your undergrad degree, bj?

JohnathanC: 7/8 social studies and 12th grade public policy.....central NY near Cooperstown

WilliamGK: Oh, there you are.

WilliamGK: Cooperstown. That's a real baseball place isn't it?

NicolH: From Cali, taught HS in Compton Unified. transitioning to Norco-Corona District (Elementary)

JohnathanC: anyone currently using music in the classroom?

JohnathanC: and how so?

WilliamGK: As often as possible.

JohnathanC: what context?

NicolH: we play music during transitions, and to open lessons (when possible)

JohnathanC: warm updiscussions....projects?

WilliamGK: Most recently to illustrate the influence of African music on American forms, like banjo.

WilliamGK: Those are good ones, Nate.

NicolH: nice

JohnathanC: I also focus on character ed

NateR: thanks Bill

JohnathanC: empathy, citizenship, social responsibility...

WilliamGK: OK, JC so what are some examples for character ed?

JohnathanC: Thought you'd never ask

JohnathanC: 1 nothing NY!

JohnathanC: sorry

FrancescLS: ha

NateR: DANG~

TishaA: lol

NicolH: for now

JohnathanC: Take a look at this page...

WilliamGK: Looks like some multitasking going on here

BJB2 rolls her eyes

JohnathanC: Read the intro at top and if you click on the images...

BJB2 . o O (glad this is a group of well rounded educators ;-))

JohnathanC: you can watch either or both of the videos we watched during the activity

BJB2: hold down the ctrl key when you click on the url

BJB2 . o O (or turn off pop up blockers)

JohnathanC: come back and discuss after that...

BJB2: then copy the url and paste into a new browser window

BJB2: everyone else doing ok?

TishaA: fine

NicolH: yup

WilliamGK: Ok, but when I go to a new browser window from Safari it dumps me out of

FrancescLS: yes

BJB2: you can select any or all of the videos, Frank

FrankGst1: Ok. Thanks

BJB2: a new browser window using a different browser, Bill?

WilliamGK: OK

BJB2 . o O (I'm assuming you are opening a new window in Safari and it's automatically opening a new TI window...that won't work)

JohnathanC: The song Swim was inspired by the singers own battle with cancer and the song Right Me Up is a tribute to their friend Manny who reminds us all to never give up and appreciate your life and stay positive....favorite line...."I'm not so weak"

JohnathanC: Did the videos work ok?

FrankGst1: No.

BJB2: yes, they worked for me

NicolH: yes

WilliamGK: OK, I used Firefox and found the site. I'll watch those later. I don't want to miss the time here with you.

BJB2: All members will get a transcript when they log out....all urls will be in the script

BJB2 nods to Bill

DanielleP: yes they worked

FrankGst1: Ok. I will watch them later...

FrancescLS: they worked for me

BJB2: Thanks, Danielle and Nicol

WilliamGK: Nate, did you step out for a hotdog?

BJB2 hopes Nate brings back a hotdog for everyone!

JohnathanC: Think the students did a good job

FrancescLS: guess he did

NateR: no, just upset with the score

NateR: watched both videos

FrancescLS: ha

JohnathanC: and bases loaded

JohnathanC: Questions for me before I continue

WilliamGK: Go forward, move ahead

NicolH: no ?'s

FrankGst1: No questions...

NateR: nope

FrancescLS: carry on

DanielleP: no

TishaA: no questions

JohnathanC: Here is a page that displays a lot of my students' work take some time to

look around...

JohnathanC: writing visuals, 3D projects...

WilliamGK: OK

TishaA: ok

DanielleP: ok

JohnathanC: Memorial Projects are one of my favorite activities

NicolH: Edgar Allen Poe - Disturbia. Very interesting.

TishaA: they are really great!

JohnathanC: The song they choose is crucial

DanielleP: I like the use of songs to represent a visual product

NicolH: yes. I like...

JohnathanC: it is played in class as a dedication song

NicolH: at what stage is the song selected?

FrankGst1: I am having tech. difs. with the videos.

FrancescLS: I'm sure it's engaging

JohnathanC: try to capture the essence of the person or event

JohnathanC: select song after you have researched the person

WilliamGK: JC, is that what the dedication project is? Select a person and then...

NicolH: after the project is built too?

JohnathanC: yes

JohnathanC: I stole the idea from this person but added the musical element and I don't require the paper

WilliamGK: Let me see a few samples and I'll be back. I'm trying to figure out how this is different from what we have been doing.

TishaA: and they can choose any song at all that they feel represents the memorial?

FrancescLS: it's a great idea. keeping these students interested in important issues/facts of history and incorporating the musical element.

JohnathanC: they must explain how and why it connects to their topic

NateR: what if you have never heard the song? Do you have them bring in the lyrics for preview?

NateR: beforehand?

JohnathanC: yes

FrancescLS: the song explains it metaphorically

FrancescLS: and sometimes realistically

JohnathanC: yes

TishaA: I really like the Buddy Holly one

FrancescLS: music can be incorporated into just about any subject. and who doesn't like music???

DanielleP: that's true and it will get the students more motivated

FrancescLS: I'm excited. I'm not teaching in a classroom but I can already see using this element

TishaA: this project is great because it incorporates all different types of creativity

JohnathanC: At first they say....I don't know any songs that mention Rosa Parks or Jackie Robinson... and then it hits them...."I Won't Back Down"

NateR: and the students love music! They want to listen to iPods in class everyday!

JohnathanC: Not about the person but about their actions and what that can teach us

FrancescLS: higher order thinking is also involved......they must research what this historical figures went thru

FrancescLS: and find deeper meaning

JohnathanC: If anyone is on Facebook I have a public group Learning From Lyrics...please join

FrancescLS: I love the idea. I will join now

TishaA: just joined

WilliamGK: Lot's of good visual metaphors in that gallery. At first I thought we were going to see more iMovies, like music videos. But I see a lot of 3-D projects that are very clever.

TishaA: I would love to keep up with ideas like this for when I go back to my classroom

JohnathanC: I also have a music education MySpace where musicians leave comments and advice for students...

FrancescLS: wow I'm sure students love that

FrankGst1 joined the room.

NateR: good stuff

TishaA: can you post a link for the myspace page?

JohnathanC: just checked it and it says service unavailable

JohnathanC: give it a try...

BJB2: There are several links in this group room on the welcome screen....you might want to join this group so you have easy access

WilliamGK: Thanks. I will come back to explore those links in more detail.

DanielleP: me too they seem like valuable resources

NateR: just added

FrankGst1: Finally able to see the links. Think they are a great resource
