introducing another site... snipurl.com (which allows you to make shortened URLs and rename them, again, very important): http://snurl.com/fifteensites

SusanR: Great minds think alike

SusanR: I shortened the URL as well http://snipurl.com/September

SusanR: That is the Text View

JeffC: If you use Trackstar to create framed pages that allow students to all remain at the one site while surfing, and snipurl to shorten the Trackstar address (which can be very lengthy, impossible to type), you actually get to the point where little kids, and even

administrators, can use the internet

KarenL: The trackstar is free?

JeffC: Trackstar is free and ad free

JeffC: So is snipurl

SusanR: Teach those youngsters about snipurl..very handy for redirecting students KarenL: Cool!

SusanR: Anyone find a useful track to use with students...after looking at THIS MONTHS TRACKS

KathrynM: looks interesting--I'm checking out the Appalachian Trail

LauraLit: I'm refining my search to Math

DavidWe listens

SusanR: why reinvent the wheel

SusanR: I did a search for online tools before preparing this session

LauraLit: Is it better to view things in frames or in text?

SusanR: What is comfortable for you?

Project Based Learning, the list goes on. I strongly recommend Frames (unless you have

very small monitors), for keeping kids on the same "base" page.

SusanR: Filamentality is a fill-in-the-blank interactive web site that guides you through picking a topic, searching the web, gathering sites, and turning web resources into one of

several kinds of web pages. Review the Filamentality Registry to see sample web pages which will serve as models or inspiration for your activity.
