DeeD: Hello to everyone. There are a bunch of rookies coming in!

EmilyW waves hi

BJB2: Yes, Marsha.

JeffC waves to everyone.

JillL: hey Jeff

DeeD: Hi Jeff. Marsha is making us do this on our very first nite!

JeffC: We'll get started in a couple of minutes. In the meantime... those that are here might want to scroll down the top frame and look at today's agenda... if they haven't done so already (it was sent via email).

JeffC: If you're not yet a member of this group: 1) Scroll down the top frame 2) Click the little "i" in the green circle (or click the link to Math Resources K-20+) 3) Click the link to join the group.

BJB2: Jeff, what is the advantage to joining a group?

JeffC: If you join the group, you can post to the Discussion board in the group room.

DavidWe: You get the K-20 Math Resources merit badge

AlyssaW: Hi!

JillL: are these resources always here in the math room

DeeD: Remember, we are a bunch of rookies. Some of us are lost already in the "math room."

AnnM: We have a boy scout in our midst

JeffC: Most groups require membership to join the group room... this room is set up to allow *everyone* to enter regardless of membership.

JeffC: OK... let's get started.

PattiS joined the room.

DavidWe waves to Patti

PattiS waves

MarshaF: I'm official and ready for my badge

JeffC: Welcome to Math Resources K-20+. I'd like everyone to begin by typing in a brief introduction... who you are, etc. I am Jeff Cooper, facilitator of this group and on Helpdesk here at Tapped In. I live in Forest Grove, Oregon.

JillL: I'm Jill Lutz. I teach Middle school computers.

BJB2 waves. I'm an art teacher in Pennsylvania and helpdesk volunteer for Tapped In

MarshaF: I'm Marsha Fassold. I am a library media specialist at an elementary school

EmilyW: I am Emily and I am on helpdesk here. I am a web designer.

DavidWe: I'm David Weksler. I work with math and science teachers helping them learn more about educational technology. I'm in New Jersey, near New York City

DawnM: I'm Dawn. I teach in the computer lab at a K-6 school in Louisiana.

PattiS: I'm Patti Schank. I'm one of the developers of Tapped In, and am a software designer

DeborahKe: I am Deb Kembell. I teach second graders. I live in Leawood, Kansas.

DeeD: Oops.I spoke too soon. I am Dee Dixon, a FACS teacher at a high school in Overland Park Ks (the promised land.)

MarshaR: I'm Marsha Ratzel and I teach 6th grade math....not too well right now but in Leawood Kansas

AnnM: I teach in an elementary self-contained classroom in Overland Park, KS

LucieM: I am an enrichment specialist at an elementary school

JillL: What an impressive group

AlyssaW: I'm Alyssa, a former HS physics teacher and current graduate student in education in Indiana

TinaS: I'm a former chem, bio, math, geology secondary teacher, currently an educ researcher

DavidWe: Impressive list, Tina

JeffC waits a sec to see if there is anyone else.

MichelleH: I teach an active 4th grade bunch in o.p., ks

DavidWe. o O (Tina is playing for the HOME team, SRI)

BJB2 cheers wildly

MarshaR . o O (Tina's list is extensive)

DavidWe smiles

TinaS: I just did what I was told-like a dutiful employee

JeffC: Most groups require membership to join the group room... this room is set up to allow *everyone* to enter regardless of membership.

DeeD: Jeff, I think maybe "we" are all here.

AnnM: I've joined.

BJB2: Membership to a group allows you to subscribe to the discussion board, whiteboard, and add files and links

CynthiaJS: I teach fifth graders at Harmony--, and I joined!

JeffC: Posting to Discussion is the first item on the agenda for today. To see the Agenda... click the Welcome link on the left, scroll down the top frame.

MarshaR: OK

JeffC: The Discussion board acts as a mini-listsery. It is one of the most powerful, yet probably under-utilized tools here at Tapped In.

JeffC: By posting to Discussion you will automatically send out your message to the almost 250 members of this group.

JeffC: Messages go out via email... there is one caveat. A number of messages (currently about 8) will bounce back to *your* email account.

MarshaR: What kind of people make up this list, if you could characterize it?

JeffC: Before people start posting to Discussion... I would like some ideas as to how to set up the Discussion board. If we really get it rocking and rolling... we need to organize it into folders.

MarshaR . o O (Not sure I would want everyone to know how much I still need to figure out by sending a message to 250 people)

JeffC: So... my first question to the group is... how should we organize the Math Folders? K-6? etc.

DavidWe . o O (topically - Geometry, for example?)

JeffC: Popup your ideas here for now... or write them on the Whiteboard (click the Whiteboard link on the left and add).

LucieM: How about math strands: algebra, data

EmilyW: I was thinking topics too

AnnM: Maybe a K-2, 3-5, 6-8, 9-10, 11-12

JeffC will add a few Folders to start.

MarshaR nodding with topics as the main organizer since so much is grade fluid

JeffC: These can change as time goes on.

JeffC: OK... I've started by adding 6 folders.

JeffC: If you click the Discussions link on the left, or the Welcome link (and scroll down) you can see them.

JeffC: This group meets here only once a month.

DeeD: We are very quiet b/c we don't know what is next!

JillL: Is there a way to see the folders without refreshing each time

JeffC: If we're going to truly collaborate... we *must* get in the habit of logging in here at least once a week and posting to Discussion, responding, etc.

JeffC: I just added the folders Jill... only one refresh was necessary.

DavidWe agrees with Jeff

DavidWe: Tapped In is useful to you if you become a regular so you know what may happen on a regular basis

TinaS: How do I chat back?

JeffC: Getting to that right now Tina.

MarshaR: Has this group met before and what work did they do last time around?

JeffC: I have added one more folder: Personal Introduction

JeffC: 1) Click on the Discussion link on the left 2) Click on the Personal Introduction folder 3) Post new topic. This will be your own personal thread for this group. People can reply to you on this thread.

DavidWe nods yes to Marsha

JeffC: Before you do that... you *might* want to "Turn Digest On" ... it's up to you.

JeffC: Right now... you will get an email for every post that is made. I prefer to keep Digest *off*... and I think for the purposes of this group... as my goal is to get a large number of posts flowing... that the Digest idea will be best in the long run for most users.

MarshaR: Jeff, there isn't a digest link on everyone's page

MarshaR: some of us have them, but not all of us

DavidWe finds that curious

JeffC: Click Discussions... don't click any folder yet... it's at the top.

DeeD: Jeff I don't have a green link Really, I don't. I don't know what to do.

JeffC: No need to post now... although before we move to the next Agenda item... we'll give a few minutes for people to post.

AnnM: Quick?. Do we want the link to say off so we don't get all the e-mails?

EmilyW: I don't have the digest link either

MarshaR: Just figured it...they didn't join the group

JeffC: You can unsubscribe... which will mean that you won't get any email... but then won't know when posts are made when they are made. Yes... you need to be a member of the Math Resources group to post (or receive) Discussion posts.

EmilyW: never mind, I figured out my own problem

DeeD: I don't even know what my problem is, but I don't think a math support group will help me. I will just observe for a while.

JeffC: That's cool Dee.

TinaS: Hi Patti. I am still trying to figure this out!

DavidWe: Hang in there, Dee. We can figure out what's going on a little later

MarshaR cracking up because I am sitting next to Dee in real life!!!! if you only knew the half of it

SusanR joined the room.

JeffC: I know I'm moving pretty fast... but I'm also trying to cover a lot today. Please type in any questions/comments you have so far about the Discussion board here.

JillL: we are trying to get into the personal intro folder, but when we click on it and click discussion nothing happens.

JeffC: Jill... after you click on the folder... click the "Post new topic" link on the top of the page.

DavidWe hopes Jeff will let him know if he can do anything in particular

MargaretTK: Hello, everyone

DavidWe: Hi, Margaret. Welcome

JillL: got it thanks

JeffC: OK... Lucie started a thread (there's an empty message though).

BJB2 . o O (just fyi, all rooms in Tapped In have the same features. So, if you learn how to use the discussion board here, and join a group, this will transfer to all the other groups.)

MargaretTK: I don't know if I belong in the math forum--I came in at 2PM CDT instead of 6 PM CDT

JeffC: Lucie... your topic is "Differentiation in math instruction" ... I'm thinking that belongs in a folder other than Personal Introduction. I can move it... what folder should it go in? Or do others think I need to move it.

DavidWe listens to Margaret's comment

JeffC: It's up to you Margaret... as a librarian... you might want to just keep tabs on this.

LucieM: I trust your judgment

JeffC: There is a Science resources group immediately following this group as well.

LucieM: Math acceleration + math enrichment=?

DavidWe smiles

DavidWe thinks

DavidWe . o O (MAME?)

DavidWe: Enrichment is often acceleration for kids ready to move ahead

MargaretTK: I'm just joking--most of the time I get it right. Once upon a time, I saved my public library system some \$\$\$ because they set the formula up wrong for splitting expenses with another library board.

LucieM: The research supports acceleration for some kids.

JeffC: OK... one thing occurred to me... your topic for Personal Introductions should be *your name*.

JeffC: Is everybody at least 50.555% comfortable with the Discussion board?

DavidWe smiles

DavidWe: Just barely...

MarshaR nods yes

DawnM: I got to edit my post.

AnnM: I'm at 50.554%

DeeD: Count me (one of the lurkers) in.

LucieM: Comfortable is a relative term

MarshaF: yep

CynthiaJS: I'm in.

DavidWe is impressed with Ann's math

AnnM grin and chuckle

JillL: we are ready

AnnM: Thanks for tolerating us. You're doing great.

MarshaR. o O (Jeff needs some sleep and we're a fiesty group tonight I think)

JillL: we are enjoying the fun

JeffC: So... yes... you can go back and change the titles. I'll probably do that as well.

JeffC: Fun is important!

AlyssaW left the room.

JeffC: Alyssa just found the Passageways link.

JeffC: ...and went to Science Resources.

JeffC: ... which brings us to our second Agenda item: Passageways.

JeffC: Adding passageways is one of the trickiest things to do here... since there are so many steps.

JeffC: I've created Passages to most of the other Math groups within Tapped In.

MarshaR: so would it be better to come here and just use all your work????

JeffC: If you want, you can create a passageway to your office as well (if you think you have resources that would be worthwhile sharing).

MarshaR: That way I'd only have to know how to get to one place

JeffC: Exactly Marsha!

LucieM: My office has a nice plant

JeffC: The important thing I wanted to let people know about Passageways is that there are other Math Resources groups here.

DavidWe: You can make "Favorite places", Marsha. They show up in the drop-down menu that helps you navigate

DavidWe has a Math and technology education group (and room)

DavidWe . o O (without much in it, though)

JeffC: More significantly... if you are involved with a class or group... and want to create a Passageway here... I want to encourage people to do so.

JillL: That sounds right up my alley

JeffC: There is a lot of duplication... missed resources... etc... since many times people don't know about the other groups within Tapped In.

MarshaR: I created one for this group that I'm with tonight from my office

DavidWe: Cool, Marsha

JeffC: Excellent Marsha

AnnM: Class pet, Marsha

DavidWe laughs

LucieM: Brown noser

DeeD: Marsh is cool and excellent!

MarshaR slinks off to the corner

JeffC: I recommend that if you are holding a class here... or have a group... you should definitely create and feature a passage between your office and the group room.

DavidWe hands Hershey chocolate out to all of the Kansas educators

AnnM smiles

JillL: thank you

DeborahKe joined the room.

DavidWe: Tough crowd, Jeff, huh?

LucieM: Very nice!

JeffC: nah

MarshaR: Don't you think this group will be quite the TI experts by the end of this school year?

DavidWe . o O (back on topic, folks, please)

JeffC: OK... if this text is flowing too fast for you... click Actions--Detach ... and maximize the chat box.

DeeD: By the way, is that a mathematical question?

JeffC: You can also enlarge your text.

DavidWe smiles

JeffC: Action-- Larger Text

MarshaR: There's a whole math floor?

JeffC: Yes Marsha

MarshaR left the room.

MarshaR joined the room.

DawnM left the room.

DavidWe grins

DawnM joined the room.

JeffC: OK... questions on Passageways?

LucieM: Remember our BV civility policy

DeeD: Let's all have good manners now!

MarshaR: Are there any of these rooms that you think are especially helpful?

DavidWe would offer an opinion if there is a momentary lull

JeffC: The ones I think are most useful are Featured on the Welcome page.

CynthiaJS left the room.

JeffC: Go for it David.

MichelleH left the room.

DavidWe: In my humble opinion, the most valuable aspect of Tapped In is the LIVE interaction that happens in discussions or in casual conversations

JillL: Is the TI office full of cool integrated technology pieces

LucieM left the room.

DavidWe: Jeff is also very interested in Online Collaboration - which is what we are doing right now

DavidWe: The opportunity for the two of us (Jeff is in Oregon, I'm in New Jersey - the two states that don't let you pump your own gas) to work with each other on an ongoing basis is pretty cool

DavidWe reminds Jeff that there is 11 minutes left before the hour

JeffC nods

MarshaR: We were talking about getting partner rooms to chat with this year....a goal mind you

JeffC: OK... let's continue this in the eye of Hurricane Central.

JillL: ok

JillL: are you pushing pages?

LucieM: We appreciate your patience with us.

JillL: or are we going through the passageways

MargaretTK: I have already joined Hurricane Central.

JeffC: I just Featured a link to it... so it's on the Welcome page.

DeeD: So am I supposed to click on Hurricane Central in the Passageways?

JeffC: Yes Dee

AnnM: Thanks

JeffC: Let's all go there now for a minute.

MargaretTK: Of course, I'm just a little west of the real hurricane central.

Room: Hurricane Central Group

MargaretTK: I can see a lot of math possibilities

JeffC: I'm not really sure how much math teaching can be integrated with what has happened with Katrina.... but... again... I figured that this would be some place that the professionals here could figure out.

DavidWe thinks there is ALWAYS ways to integrate more math

DeeD: Right now, "data" seems to be much less important than the human pain.

MarshaF: comparing/contrasting wind speed to temperature data perhaps

JeffC: Good Marsha...

MarshaR: Or even how much is left to pump out....

EmilyW: I think data and charting would be something math related to do

MarshaF: estimating the time it takes to pump out the water

MichelleH: excellent Marsha!

MarshaR: Can you imagine plotting all the locations of where people have gone?

TerriJS: There is also graphing and analysis to do

JillL: if you chart be sure to use Excel

LucieM: Data collection--perhaps using EXCEL to organize data

JeffC: Again... just as the Math Resources group is involved with getting math educators to collaborate... Hurricane Central is dedicated to getting people in all disciplines to collaborate.

JeffC: Good ideas Terri and Lucie.

AnitaMB: I live around 90 miles from the N.O. Orleans area. Our classes are overflowing with evacuees. Most of the students are just trying to get back into a routine.

MarshaR: Did a group like this help teachers through 9/11

JeffC: OK... one more thing on the Agenda: K-12 Classes here.

JillL: we had two families come to us today in ks

BJB2: to a small extent, Marsha

BJB2: the counseling resources were available

AnitaMB: I think that later, when it's not as fresh in their minds, we can consider integrating the situation into other areas.

MichelleH: we had 3

MargaretTK: What about calculating need for a new shelter & figuring out how many people can be housed. I think that's what happened to the superdome--no one realized that it takes more square footage to house a person than it does for that same person to be sitting with his beer & hot dogs watching a game.

JillL: awesome idea

DavidWe: Good idea, Michelle

TerriJS: so true

JeffC: There isn't time to go into creation of K-12 classes... but there is a K-12 group here... every educator can create up to two groups... either regular or K-12. Just so you know... you can create a group and bring your K-12 students to Tapped In in complete security.

JillL: we have to go

MichelleH: good-bye

DeeD: Jeff and Dave,

MargaretTK: We have 30 new students

LucieM: Goodbye, and thanks for everything!

JillL: thank you so much for being patient with us

MarshaF: It has been informative. Thanks for tolerating us tonight.

JillL: we will be back

DeborahKe: Goodbye, thanks for hosting tonight

BJB2: There is a School Counselor's discussion on Sept 22

JeffC: Thank everyone for coming... please remember to post back to the Math Resources K-20+ group! Have a great year everybody.

TerriJS: later gators time for science

MarshaR: Thank you for all your help...I hope people take some of these ideas and apply them to their students

BJB2: that will share lots of resources to help kids cope

TinaS: Bye!

AnnM: Our class is ending. Jeff and David, thank you for your time and guidance.

CletasC: Thank you for spending time with us. It was very enjoyable.

DavidWe: I can answer any other questions if there are any?

SusanR: Thanks Jeff

DeeD: J & D, thank you for tolerating our group. We did learn a lot. I had no idea about this resource. What a great way to support teachers and teaching.

DavidWe: You guys were great, Dee

DavidWe: It's a challenge to do a real discussion on your first trip to Tapped In
