LynneW: Welcome Matt

LynneW: What do you teach Matt?

MattE: Business, technology and careers.

LynneW: Great.

LynneW: Jeff?

HeatherBu . o O (Michelle, if you are interested in working in a small middle school, give me a ring!)

JeffC: Hi, I'm Jeff Cooper, Tapped In Helpdesk and in Forest Grove Oregon (near Lynne).

SeanMa: Thanks for the document Lynn, web based applications are the most exciting topic I've been able to focus on over the last year.

JeffC: I teach Computer Applications in Sebastian Florida

LynneW: There is a document with embedded links that I have created. It is available in this room. Please download it.

LynneW: I am interested to know from each of you what you hope to gain from investing in this session.

SeanMa: More ideas of what's out there and how it's being used in education.

LynneW: Great

LynneW: Anyone else?

HeatherBu: How to make these tools work for me and my students

MichelleRM: I am big on finding ideas and tools to use in my classroom once I begin to teach - and I think the internet is an awesome resource....anything that will help me be a better teacher and help my students achieve....

JeffC: I am a returnee from last month and ready to suck up more information

MattE: I am trying out Tapped In for the first time and thought this would be an interesting topic.

LynneW laughs with joy

LynneW: Let's start with what you know about Web 2.0

LynneW: Anybody have a sense of it?

SeanMa: Read write web... web based applications, am I on the right track?

JeffC: more flexible and more interactive

LynneW: Yes YES!

MichelleRM: I had never heard of it before today

LynneW: This is a definite movement toward an empowerment of the individual user

LynneW: Web 2.0 is also becoming a very different business model

LynneW: With interesting implications

JeffC: they are???????

LynneW: The resources we will be exploring today are all free.

LynneW: Most of them also require a registration process.

JeffC: The registration process is to cut down SPAM?

JoelRo: Had some problems with my browser

LynneW: Since we can't take the time to register at these sites, I'll talk to you about them.

LynneW: Yes

SeanMa: I've been amazed at what is available at no cost to add your content to the internet. Some of your list was familiar but most I haven't heard of.

LynneW: Welcome Joel. Would you like to introduce yourself?

MichelleRM: So is Web 2.0 an actual different internet structure...or is it just a name for the new internet age?

JoelRo: Thank you

LynneW: Web 2.0 is a new way of thinking and interacting and includes new capabilities, new types of application coding. You will see a great deal of emphasis on social networking, collaboration

JoelRo: I am an algebra teacher in Wichita Falls TX and enrolled in a masters program at Midwestern state university

LynneW: Developers are making these applications so easy to use, you no longer need to buy many software applications.

JoelRo: Curriculum and instructions to be exact

LynneW: Wonderful Joel.

LynneW: I am going to project a web site to you.

JoelRo: Awesome

LynneW: That means a new browser window will open to the web site I want to take you

to.

LynneW: Turn off your pop-up blockers.

JoelRo: ok

LynneW: This site is not on the list. Please add it.

LynneW: The site is called Thinkfree

JeffC: Is there anyone who needs help allowing popups from this site?

LynneW: It is an MS Office applications mirror online. It is free, gives you 30MB storage space for free, and allows free conversions to .pdf

LynneW: Upper right hand corner

LynneW: I have created screen captures of what these applications and their user interface look like.

LynneW: However, I am not able to upload documents in this room.

LynneW: I also did the same thing for several other resources.

LynneW: If you would like me to email these documents to you, I would be happy to do so.

LynneW: Each of these applications has all the capabilities of Word, Excel and PowerPoint.

JeffC: Thinkfree is a free online office application, but they encourage you to download their Thinkfree Office for 30 days free trial. Question: Why not use Open Office or Star Office on your computer and Thinkfree online... wouldn't everything be 100% free then?

LynneW: This is particularly wonderful for our students who may not be able to afford these software programs at home.

HeatherBu: and they have a portable version?

LynneW: Thinkfree Office is for organizations. The free online version is for individuals.

LynneW: Thinkfree online means students can access their documents from wherever they are.

LynneW: Say you assign a PowerPoint presentation and they don't have a jump drive or CD burner to bring it to school.

LynneW: They can create their PowerPoint here and then download and/or present their presentation from Thinkfree online.

HeatherBu . o O (great for History or Science Fair projects.)

SeanMa: so the application is run online as well as document storage and organization?

LynneW: Exactly

LvnneW: Yes

MichelleRM . o O (Wow! This is cool!)

JeffC: I normally have them email it to me, but this way I would not have to handle it

LynneW: There are some files that must be downloaded to your local computer but they are small and go quickly. This is a one time only.

JoelRo: Awesome!!!

HeatherBu . o O (caveat: it requires an email address)

SeanMa: I looked at OpenOffice prior, are there drawbacks to thinkfree that you are aware of?

LynneW: Yes, you must register so you can authenticate yourself as a real user and not a bot

LynneW: OpenOffice is great if you want to host the software and maintain it on your own machine.

JoelRo: also, after the 30 day trial what future cost are incurred

LynneW: The point is....Web 2.0 allows you to have the same capabilities without having to download or manage the software.

LynneW: There is no time limit on Thinkfree for the online use.

LynneW: It is free

JoelRo: cool

LynneW: You don't have to engage the 30-day free trial.

SeanMa: I've had good experiences with our networks in my area over the past five years... do others have the same experience?

JeffC: free is good

HeatherBu: Free is very good!

LynneW: What about Sean's question?

LynneW: Sean, what in particular are you thinking? Fast connections, reliable??

SeanMa: Down time and connection speeds....

JeffC: I think the individual district networks are getting more stable if that is what you mean

LynneW: Are you ready for another resource?

SeanMa: Yep.

HeatherBu: Please

JeffC: My house is networked with Macintoshes

JoelRo: right on

MichelleRM: Definitely.

MichelleRM: Keep em coming!

LynneW: 30 boxes is an online calendaring application. It allows you to designate who can access the calendar and who can add items to it.

JeffC: I will drop out and write a webquest for class. Thanks for the information

SeanMa: any similarities to the 4teachers.org calendar tool?

LynneW: It has been a while since I looked at that resource. I'm not sure.

LynneW: This is good for students and/or families to stay connected with each other's schedules.

SeanMa: it looks similar but better aesthetics and options.

LynneW: Also good for co-curricular activities and classroom events, dates, deadlines.

LynneW: Teachers use this as a tool for parents to stay in touch with what was covered in a particular day and what is due and when.

LynneW: Also for field trip announcements, calls for volunteers, etc.

SeanMa: Can you add links and documents to the calendar?

LynneW: Good question. I haven't tried.

SeanMa: I would guess that you can. My hosting company Bluehost has an open-source calendar that you can install, similar to this but on your own space.

JoelRo: that's great for keeping up with test and quizzes

LynneW: You can make links to web pages on any entry.

LynneW: Are you ready for another resource?

SeanMa: yes

JoelRo: yep

HeatherBu nods

MattE: yes

LynneW: This one has been around for awhile - Casa Notes for Teachers

LynneW: You will note that there is a Spanish option available

LynneW: What do you think?

MichelleRM: It's a great resource - it makes creating notes so easy.

JoelRo: All the template are there and ready to use

LynneW: Are you ready for yet another resource?

SeanMa: yep

MichelleRM: Yes

HeatherBu: Let's go

MattE: I have to leave. Thanks for the information.

LynneW: This one is very popular with students across most grade levels.

LynneW: Bye Matt. Thanks for coming.
