**LynneW**: For those of you who just joined us, please introduce yourselves by name, geographic location, and university affiliation.

**LynneW**: Welcome to everyone this evening.'

**KevilinaB**: I am Kevilina Burbank, Portland OR, student at Concordia

**RodHe**: I'm Rod Heiser, I live in Troutdale, Oregon and I am an MATE student at Concordia University.

**LynneW**: Thank you all for joining us this evening!

**JeffC**: I'm Jeff Cooper, on Tapped In Helpdesk and Concordia Adjunct (many of the students here are mine). They're all in CU533w which is a course designed by Lynne that I feel very fortunate to be teaching.

**KevilinaB**: you're welcome 25 times.

**LynneW**: I like to start our sessions with a quick discussion about what web 2.0 tools are all about and how they can be used in schools.

**LynneW**: This room has a wealth of free resources to web 2.0 online tools.

**LynneW**: They are organized in folders by function.

**LynneW**: Web 2.0 is used to describe the fairly recent development of free browser-based applications.

**LynneW**: There is usually a connection to some type of collaboration, publication, and/or social networking.

**LynneW**: Questions?

**SuTuanL**: Must it be free?

**LynneW**: No, however they usually are free. I have stipulated that the resources posted here be free.

**LynneW**: Any other questions about Web 2.0? I know I gave you a very cursory definition.

**LynneW**: Tonight I have two different resources for you.

LynneW: First is an intentionally designed social networking community- a healthy

alternative to MySpace that is "family friendly".

LynneW: I just heard about this space on NPR two days ago.

**JulieAF**: Hello, I am from Sandy, Oregon up by Mt. Hood, going to school in Portland, Oregon Concordia University. However I am originally from Scobey, Montanta

LynneW: Great.

LynneW projects http://www.worldwidenest.com/index.php

DavidWe: Cool, Lynne

**LynneW**: Yes, take a look at the site. You need to register before you can go in. I was just going to explain what this site does.

**LynneW**: When you are back, please let me know.

**LynneW**: Are you guys and gals with me?

**JeffC** is registered.

MichaelM: I'm back

LynneW: Great Jeff and Michael

MelissaLe: yes

WayneRS: yep

JulieAF: Yes

SuTuanL: I am here

JosiahL: yeah I am hanging in there

LynneW: Very good!

**LynneW**: A "nest" is like a group room here in Tapped In.

**LynneW**: You can invite anyone you want to be a member just as we do here.

RodHe: Yes.

**LynneW**: The nest includes a calendar, a blog, and a photo sharing space.

LynneW: The creator/admin can maintain a list of contacts also.

**JosiahL**: in what ways is it different?

**LynneW**: It is just an alternative to TI but different because of the personal calendar and shared blog.

**LynneW**: As a teacher, you could use it for your students' parents and/or your students.

**SuTuanL**: Could be used for class teaching.

JulieAF: That's cool

**LynneW**: It is protected as a "family friendly" site but has some features that make it a little different.

**LynneW**: Here in TI it is very education focused.

JulieAF: So, could you build a nest that only parents could access, and not students

**LynneW**: These "nests" could be for multiple groups - church, family, athletics, cheerleading, student government, etc.

**MichaelM**: The registration says I must have a six char login. Apparently my email address is to long

LynneW: Yes

**LynneW**: The login is different than your email.

**JosiahL**: and they are exclusive (invite only)?

**LynneW**: Like here your login is Michael M

**LynneW**: Yes Josiah, they are exclusive. No one gets in unless you invite them.

MichaelM: oh

**LynneW**: You can choose to make your nest public or private.

**MichaelM**: Like ours at helpingstudents.org

**KevilinaB**: are we to go ahead and create accounts on this "nest?"

**LynneW**: It may be a nice alternative for middle schoolers who have an eye on MySpace.

**LynneW**: Only if you want to. Our sessions are just to share web 2.0 resources that could be used by schools

**LynneW**: Creating a nest is extremely easy and user friendly.

**LynneW**: Any other questions about worldwide nest before I move on to another resource?

JulieAF: Yes

MelissaLe: do you have to have e-mails of those you wish to view

MelissaLe: the site?

**LynneW**: Not necessarily. If the nest is set up to be public, you can search for it from the home page.

**JulieAF**: Is it a good alternative, because we can control it, and keep them busy in a more guarded arena?

**LynneW**: Each nest is created within a category. Education is one of the categories.

LynneW: Yes Julie

JulieAF: Awesome!

**LynneW**: Also very low impact so family members who are not computer savvy could use this site successfully.

LynneW: Now, I want to switch gears on you.

**LynneW**: The next resource was added to our group room by a new member from Berlin.

**LynneW**: The web site is called "Slidestory"

**LynneW**: It is a free site that will host photo-based story telling coupled with audio tracks. They also host podcasts for free.

**LynneW**: Again, you need to register and then download the "publisher" interface.

**LynneW**: I will project this web site and give you a minute or two to check it out. Please let me know when you return.

**LynneW** projects http://www.slidestory.com/?page=index

JosiahL: that is a cool site

**LynneW**: I'm glad you like it.

**KevilinaB**: I clicked on a picture, and it looked like she had a great bottle of wine.

**LynneW**: You are required to add an audio track to each slide before you can "publish" your slide story.

**LynneW**: So you need to have an audio input device on your computer (mic of some kind)

**BJB2**: when the slide show is published, do you have to log in to be able to view?

**BJB2** . o O ( or can anyone view )

**LynneW**: No, anyone can view it.

**LynneW**: All they need is the link.

**LynneW**: Wouldn't that be a great resource for student art work projects?

MelissaLe: back - what a cool site

**SusanR** . o O ( reminds me of Bubbleshare )

**LynneW**: It is like looking at a PPT presentation viewed from a browser.

LynneW: Yes - Bubbleshare - I agree

JosiahL: yeah a great blog link

**SuTuanL**: Cool, Flickr can do similar slideshow, too.

**LynneW**: I have a resource for you to go along with Slidestory.

**SusanR**: although it is a Windows only program

**MelissaLe**: under the education link, it tells how you can save a PPT presentation into a slidestory

**MelissaLe**: that way you won't have to re-do you PPTs

**LynneW**: It is a web site with a full list of modules and pdf documents about integrating digital storytelling in the classroom.

**LynneW**: This could be used as a professional development resource for teachers as well as an instructional resource for learners.

**JulieAF**: Awesome, this would be great for creating cultural awareness, or for foreign language classes.

**LynneW**: And your connections are exactly what Web 2.0 Tools for Schools is all about.

**LynneW**: Using these resources in creative ways for engaged learning in the classroom.

**SuTuanL**: This is even greater.

**LynneW**: This is all I have to share with you this month. Next month we will not have a session.

LynneW: Our next session will be in January, 2007

MelissaLe: do you do different resources each session or each month?

LvnneW: Yes Julie for one year

JulieAF: Cool

CarolN: thank you Lynn. I'll be trying some of these tools.

LynneW: The link has been added under Wikis

SusanR: the editing features feel very much like Microsoft Word

**LynneW**: In Tastyword?

MichaelM: We are a non profit called Helping Students Education Corp

SusanR: yes, Tastyword

**LynneW**: The site seems very clean and simply elegant.

**LynneW**: I like that.

**LynneW**: Michael how did you come to create the non-profit and what is your mission?

MichaelM: I started in 1998 by going to Java conferences

**MichaelM**: Our mission is to promote education and empower communities as stated in our articles of Inc.

**LynneW**: What do you hope to empower communities to do or be?

**MichaelM**: We empower communities by providing information and free wikis to teachers

LynneW: I am often asked how these services can be free.

**LynneW**: How would you answer that question?

**MichaelM**: It is not just another Wiki but a Wiki specifically designed for education.

**LynneW**: Is it a significant amount of money needed to host these spaces for "free"?

**MichaelM**: Good question. We are growing, but get paid from google adsense

LynneW: Ahhh

MichaelM: I have spent much of my own

**LynneW**: In what ways has "education" informed your user interface and site policies?

MichaelM: thousands

**LynneW**: What motivates you to provide these resources and to do this work? I'm often asked that question as well.

MichaelM: I love organizing data

**LynneW**: Bless you for that.

MichaelM: and it provides a great community information resource

MichaelM: Thank you. God bless you as well

**LynneW**: Thank you for your contributions to the education community. Thank you for joining us tonight.

LynneW: Please come back.

**MichaelM**: I sent you a username and password. Will you try it out and customize the OR area

**LynneW**: Absolutely.

MichaelM: Great Thank you.
