RobinE: How is everyone doing?

BJB2: are you involved in the BirdSleuth project, Robin?

JenniferMF: wondered if you had ideas/suggestions and/or might be willing to try that

out?!?

JenniferMF: I know your kids tend to be tech savvy.

RobinE: You know me... I'll try just about anything!

JenniferMF: Think podcast reports-- maybe news-style reports?

JenniferMF: Or power point shows for teachers/schools with less access.

RobinE: Podcasting is big at our school - we could totally do that!

JenniferMF: Something beyond "simple" written reports.

JenniferMF: Oh-- GREAT!!!!

JenniferMF: We were hoping to possibly see if we could find a couple of teachers to try out the idea this spring/summer...

RobinE: Actually - I could make a multimedia requirement---- have them create the reports in several different formats

JenniferMF: to use as an example for next year's crew.

RobinE: Our kids have started a news broadcasting network that gets posted on line

JenniferMF: That would be so cool!!!!!! Great examples maybe!

RobinE: it's not related to my class - the media folks are doing it

JenniferMF: I mean a great variety of example s =)

RobinE: I could easily connect with them - I'm not sure how they do all of it - I know it's linked to the school webpage

JenniferMF: BJ-- the idea came to me in one of this week's TI discussions... someone asked about podcasts, and I later thought "Eureka!"

BJB2: cool!

RobinE: The kids are doing their final reports next week

JenniferMF: Robin, in my head, I'm just thinking, wouldn't it be cool if, for example, those girls from last year were to SHOW us about their music effecting birds experiment!

JenniferMF: tell us what they did, what they found, show us how they set it up, etc.

JenniferMF: Anyway, if you have an interest in trying to pull anything off this year, I would be VERY interested in trying to showcase it!!!

RobinE: It may be easier to work with a few volunteers from this year's group - last year's are off at high school - it would be hard to coordinate with them

JenniferMF: Of course. I mean with this year's kids... but in my head I was just thinking of a cool example from last year =)

RobinE: I bet I could get a few kids easily to volunteer to do something

RobinE: There were some funny projects this year (not the most scientifically challenging questions from this group!- but some good ones and a few worth a few chuckles!

JenniferMF: I can't wait to get them =)

JenniferMF: maybe this group would do some really fun/engaging videos then.

RobinE: I know a few groups have even taken some video clips

RobinE: This project I'm working on for the school could generate a plethera of this type of project idea for you ...

JenniferMF: Well, Robin, that would be just wonderful! What do we need to be concerned about legal-wise...

JenniferMF: I mean with posting/sharing videos?

RobinE: ID

JenniferMF: Not that they aren't all on youtube anyway!

RobinE: no kidding

JenniferMF: OMG

JenniferMF: lol

RobinE: As long as we don't use last names and/or identifying locations, we should be all set. If we don't even use first names, we may gain some "freedom"

BJB2: you might want to look into partnering with www.nextvista.org

JenniferMF: Our assumption has been anything teachers send us is OK to publish/post,

so long as no last names.

RobinE: I suppose they could create avatars (???) - but I find those to be a bit cheezy and a block to the spirit of genuine collaboration!

JenniferMF: I will check that site.

RobinE: me too

RobinE: So - for the immediate future - are you thinking podcasts?

JenniferMF: Yep.

RobinE: I could have a few kids do that

RobinE: I can also have a few post their video of their report/skit to the school webpage for you to check out.

JenniferMF: Really, anything... even "radio expedition" style (only audio)

RobinE: We have presentations coming up/ CAT testing, then vacation, so the plates are a bit full - it may take a few weeks to get it together

JenniferMF: That would be great. Again, it would be great to have anything this year... 1 as an example for others, and 2, to try to get the technology worked out on our end (how to organize and post them, etc.)

RobinE: I know Sheila would help me out with this as well

RobinE: Sounds like a good mission!

JenniferMF: That is totally fine. I'm thinking unveil it just in time for the next school year.

RobinE: That should be totally doable

JenniferMF: Like you mentioned... even filming the presentations would be more than we have =)

JenniferMF: or more than I even envisioned 2 days ago =)

RobinE: I'll start working on some ideas and get the kids input too - they are quite creative and they have insights into what works for kids!

JenniferMF: that's awesome. Thanks so very much.

RobinE: no prob! It will be fun

JenniferMF: it seems like fun!

JenniferMF: That's one of the reasons I'm excited about it!

RobinE: Remind me ---- when I'm pulling my hair out! :)

JenniferMF: oh please don't do that =)

RobinE: I'm just joshing

RobinE: We have GOT to talk - this will all fit together so nicely - it's like we're on a

single plane in the universe!

JenniferMF: And even synch chat isn't quite good enough.

RobinE: true

JenniferMF. o O (MEET THIS SUMMER!)

RobinE: ABSOLUTELY!

RobinE: Are you getting a good response to the inquiry stuff?

JenniferMF: Pretty good. I feel like my world has shifted over the last month or so.

RobinE: My dissertation project may challenge our reasons for why it works

RobinE: in what way

JenniferMF: I'm intrigued!!!!!!

RobinE: Shifting how? To where?

JenniferMF: Robin, shifting towards more focus on online support... social networking...

just really trying to think "out of the box"...

RobinE: I think that's a good thing to be investigating

JenniferMF: like we've been publishing results in Classroom BirdScope for 10 years....

RobinE: That's so the world now!

JenniferMF: but it's almost 2010. We need to move.

JenniferMF: to be on the cutting edge more.

RobinE: makes sense

JenniferMF: which is strange cause sometimes the comfort zone feels nice =)

RobinE: yep

RobinE: But the "stretch zone" is where the best stuff happens!

JenniferMF: Exactly. So I think... keep publishing... but for those teachers whose world is podcasts and youtube and tech... offer them space for that through BirdSleuth inquiry.

RobinE: sounds good!

RobinE: The virtual world is the future

JenniferMF: And also, I'm becoming more intrigued than ever with the "how to" around supporting inquiry in the virtual world.

RobinE: kids are so savvy with it too - they really have fun with it - it's motivating to them

JenniferMF: Budgets are BAD. It has to be the future whether we want it or not.

JenniferMF: No money to travel to people.

JenniferMF: We need to think of ways to push it to them.

RobinE: We should totally collaborate

RobinE: I've got great things on the horizon - I hope!

EllenRP: I'm not sure what I'm doing yet.

RobinE: That's ok -

RobinE: once it's sorted out - it will go smoothly!

JenniferMF: Yep... once you get it, you've got it... like riding a bicycle?!?

RobinE: This is suspenseful! In a good way!

EllenRP: Are you a regular member of this group?

RobinE: I am trying to be a regular member - only just got started with "Tapped in" - this

is my second visit

JenniferMF: Ellen, I created the group... I'm the project leader for BirdSleuth.

EllenRP: Hello

RobinE: I think this group has amazing potential

EllenRP: I'm very interested in inquiry based learning.

RobinE: Great!!

JenniferMF: I'd like to better understand ways that resources like Tapped In might help me support teachers (and teachers support each other) in inquiry =)

EllenRP: Has there been discussion about getting teachers to move in this direction and their fears?

RobinE: Have you done much with inquiry based learning? Are you new to the idea/process?

RobinE: The discussions are getting more numerous

JenniferMF: Some discussion about the challenges and fears... for example, the time it takes, how much guidance to offer students and when, etc.

JenniferMF: Ellen, I see you're a media center director. Do you work with teachers-- i.e. offer professional development?

JenniferMF: Or mostly work with students?

EllenRP: This is my first year as an LMC Director, but I would like to bring this process into their research and information literacy.
