BJB2 nods

TomF: right

KathrynF joined the room.

TomF: so I'll just click elsewhere for now:)

LynneW: Hi Kathryn

LynneW: Welcome

BJB2: as long as you don't click on any doors or buildings you should be fine

SusanR joined the room.

BJB2: I'll announce in a couple of minutes, Lynne

SusanR: Hi Lynne

SusanR: and company

LynneW: Hi Sue

BJB2 . o O (everyone here just ignore the announcement...you're in the right room)

LynneW: Nice to "see" you.

SusanR: ditto

SusanR: I attended Tony Vincent's session on the ipodtouch at NECC

LynneW: Isn't Tony great?

SusanR: yep

LynneW: He is one of my favorite ed tech folks.

SusanR: let me look at my notes

LynneW: Welcome everyone!

LynneW: My name is Lynne Wolters and I facilitate this group. I come to you from

LynneW: Please introduce yourselves.

KathrynF: I'm a school librarian in upstate New York.

BJB2: I'm on Tapped In helpdesk and am located in Pennsylvania

TomF: I'm Tom Fullerton, I teach at Simon Fraser University in Vancouver, BC, Canada

SusanR: I am Sue Roseman and I facilitate the K to 3+ Great Resources sessions. I am from Ottawa, Ontario.

LynneW: Thank you for attending our session.

LynneW: As usual, we will visit a site for a quick look and then come back here for a quick brain storm about how that resource could be used in the classroom.

LynneW: Then we move on to the next resource.

LynneW: All session links are posted in the Welcome Note.

LynneW: I will repost them here also.

LynneW: Today's first site is GeoCube

LynneW: http://www.geo-cube.eu/

LynneW: Let me know when you have returned.

BJB2 checks to make sure everyone got the url

LynneW: The "How It Works" video uses Quick Time

LynneW: Geocube is an attractive online resource about Geography. Geocube is based on the principle of the Rubik Cube with six faces and 54 topics. It is a virtual and easily accessible website which is available online for free. Move the Geocube around with your mouse and explore the faces and topics. Geocube provides an accessible way to read, see and watch what Geography is and geographers do. This is a European initiative developed by HERODOT, the European Network for Geography in Higher Education and is available to anyone who is interested in Geography.

LynneW: Under "Downloads" is a link to a pdf document that explains how to make your own GeoCube template.

TomF: Hi Lynne, the pdf opens a template I could print and fold, tape together

TomF: are there digital templates as well?

LynneW: I was just looking for the link to a "how teachers can use GeoCube" page.

LynneW: BRB

KathrynF: I'm stuck on a page that wants me to update my Quicktime. Gah, and my computer is only one week old.

TomF: always updates,

BJB2: Kathryn, all the urls and directions will be in your transcript...so you can check later

KathrynF: It does make me wonder about the site's accessibility. How well would a student with limited hand coordination work with the site, for instance? I was looking for information on keyboard access - but the help files are only available in QuickTime

KathrynF: Other than that, it looks very intriguing. Good jumping-off spots for more detailed lessons/investigations of the topics presented

TomF: makes it hard to use screen readers as well

KathrynF: impossible, I would think

TomF: would use pdf version for those students

SusanR: a hook to get students motivated for social studies and geography

KathrynF: *nod*

LynneW: Of course, I can't relocate it.

LynneW: I'll post it later.

LynneW: This is an interesting user interface. Yes, it has limitations for accommodation.

LynneW: However, it is an interesting expression of perspective and interconnection.

TomF: I'm wondering if they would be interested in creating a place for student comments on the site

KathrynF: ... I need to log off and on again. The QT thing has locked up my browser

LynneW: Tom, I would ask.

KathrynF left the room (signed off).

LynneW: There are several YouTube videos using GeoCube and a particular topic.

LynneW: Are you ready to move on?

TomF: sure

LynneW: The next resource is "60 second recap"

LynneW: http://www.60secondrecap.com/library/

KathrynF joined the room.

LynneW: You can request that particular recaps be done.

LynneW: Go check it out.

KathrynF: ...back

LynneW: Hi == we are visiting 60 second recap

LynneW: http://www.60secondrecap.com/library/

SusanR: love the pick of the week

SusanR: great motivator

LynneW: Video chunking?

LynneW: Another in the "explainer" video services.

SusanR: Students can post their own recaps I believe

LynneW: Yes, lots of student video responses under Club Recap

LynneW: Who is with me?

TomF: this looks very promising

LynneW: Tom, how would you see this being used?

LynneW: Students are both an authentic audience and providing content to an authentic

audience.

TomF: engage students in a lit exploration prior to lit circles or as an ind. study

TomF: post responses to texts

TomF: I like the resources section as well

LynneW: Do you see this being an adjunct to a kids book club?

TomF: my only hesitation is kids posting here or responding with video publicly

TomF: but if it gets young students excited about reading, wonderful!

LynneW: This could be modeled for a closed system using Moodle or another tool.

LynneW: Sue, what do you think?

TomF: yes, that's what I was wondering

SusanR: I agree with Tom

TomF: did a workshop on video book jackets that was similar

LynneW: Any other suggestions for use before we move on?

TomF: trying to find out who created this

LynneW: Click on the home page and then "Who is Jenny?"

SusanR: I would use it to introduce new topics to help perk student engagement

LynneW: I assume kids like to hear what other kids have to say.

LynneW: Kids modeling reading for each other is a good thing.

SusanR: She has star appeal

LynneW: I'm going to move on to another resource.

LynneW: Skipping down to AlternativeTO

LynneW: http://alternativeto.net/

LynneW: Note it is divided into desktop or mobile apps

StephanieO joined the room.

LynneW: Hi Stephanie - welcome

StephanieO: hi thanks for the welcome

LynneW: We are moving from 60 Second Recap to AlternativeTo

LynneW: Links are posted in the Welcome note above.

LynneW: http://www.60secondrecap.com

LynneW: http://alternativeto.net/

KathrynF: Oh, now that is the sort of resource I use for myself and suggest for others at

work.

LynneW: What resource?

LynneW: Are you referring to AlternativeTo?

KathrynF: yes

StephanieO: what exactly is this site AlternativeTo?

LynneW: AlternativeTo is a new approach to finding good software. Tell us what application you want to replace and we give you great alternatives, based on user recommendations.

KathrynF: It's free/open source alternative to proprietary software

LynneW: Most are open source

KathrynF: Another source of such is http://www.osalt.com/

TomF: yes

TomF: like it

LynneW: Thanks Kathryn

TomF: students should not have to purchase software anymore

LynneW: I agree

StephanieO: wow

TomF: there are free alternatives to complete all of their projects

KathrynF: There's also http://osliving.com/index.php and http://www.theopendisc.com/

LynneW: I like this site because it gives multiple choices and is vetted by users.

SusanR: I instantly know what is free and what will work with my MAC ..that is handy

KathrynF coughs. She has been a bit interested in this topic before, yes.

LynneW smiles at Kathryn

LynneW: I want to move us to the Google in the Classroom Resources to give you a chuck of time to explore.

LynneW: Great classroom project.

LynneW: I came across this when a business professional published a link here for access to a professional publication he had written.

KathrynF: nice

StephanieO: I am still checking it out can we look at the other sites mentioned?

KathrynF: I don't think I had that one on my list of free ebooks before.

BJB2 . o O (just below the tabs)

BJB2: in the grey bar on the web window

BJB2: if you don't see Room View then you probably see the welcome screen

KathrynF: I see a grey bar - it doesn't say Room View.

BJB2: on the left is the Welcome note and next to it is the Motivational Poster

KathrynF: yes

KathrynF: I see a poster

BJB2: scroll down on the welcome note to This is the group room for [information]Web 2.0 Tools for Schools

KathrynF: Aha!

BJB2: click on that green i

KathrynF: gotcha!

BJB2: you will then see the group ID page

BJB2: and select Join this group

KathrynF: that's kinda buried in all the text, isn't it?

KathrynF: kk - done

BJB2: well, there are other ways to join groups, but since you're in the group room, that's the easiest
