BjB: I'm a retired communication and art teacher in Pennsylvania and am on Tapped In helpdesk

KaitlynS: I am Kaitlyn. I work primarily with students who are Deaf who have additional needs. Taught for 5 years in the States and am now at a school in the United Kingdom.

JeffC: I'm in Forest Grove Oregon, on Tapped In Helpdesk, and a lifelong class clown.

MelissaMM: I am Melissa. I am a student teacher from Houston

BjB: what do you hope to teach, Melissa?

NancyMD: I am Nancy from Houston, and I am currently student teaching in an elementary school

KaitlynS: This site has live video workshops that you can watch, quizzes to take, and further extension activities in order to get those application points.

JeffC: here's a redirect for the same site: http://sn.im/elearning1

BjB: the site is free, but does the resource give teachers cue's?

BjB . o O (continuing units of education)

KaitlynS: It does give you a form for completing quizzes for you to turn into your school district.

BjB: thanks, Kaitlyn

NancyMD: yes, just looking around

MelissaMM: wow great

KaitlynS: It's up to the school district to allot points, but my school district was very receptive to this idea.

NancyMD: very interesting

KaitlynS: The workshops are all quality teachers or colleagues in the field of education.

JeffC: have any district that doesn't accept CUEs from that site contact me... I'll arrange a

pie in the face.

KaitlynS: haha

NancyMD: lol

MelissaMM: haha

KaitlynS: Again, if you have any questions or comments or add in's, please do not hesitate. I'd love to hear any of your resources as well.

KaitlynS: You do need to register for this site with a working email, but it is free.

KaitlynS: The next site is http://www.thirteen.org/edonline/concept2class/

KaitlynS: Take your time either browsing the first one or moving on to the second site.

NancyMD: ok

KaitlynS: All sites are posted in this room under the folder Kaitlyn's Prof. Dev. Resources

KaitlynS: You will also receive a transcript of this discussion to your email so don't feel like you may be missing anything vital by taking time to browse.

BiB: thanks for that transcript reminder, Kaitlyn

KaitlynS: In this site if you click on one of the modules and look at the top right "Get Credit".

KaitlynS: If you click on this, it has pre-written letters for your administrator explaining the website, modules, and why your administrator should give you loads of credit:)

MelissaMM: I like how they provide a letter for administrators

BjB wonders if Tapped In can do something similar

KaitlynS: I like this site as well because it has loads of extension activities!

KaitlynS: I have found it to be useful with my school district.

KaitlynS: We have quite the strict committee for administering points.

NancyMD: I like how it answers possible questions teachers may have

KaitlynS: With the rise of inclusion I have found http://www.autismnetwork.org/ to be quite the useful site as well.

KaitlynS: It is a very quality site on autism.

KaitlynS: It has modules for several facts and how-to's when working with students who have autism.

KaitlynS: This site does have reading materials, a few videos, and quizzes.

KaitlynS: The downfall is it is on the honor system for receiving points.

KaitlynS: I talked with my school district and kept a log of reading and turned in my printed-out quizzes I took.

KaitlynS: I also created lessons to show that I was taking what I had learned and implementing it.

MelissaMM: good idea

KaitlynS: If ever down the road, you have a student with autism, I highly recommend this site.

BjB: with mainstreaming, all educators must be ready for any special learning needs students

KaitlynS: exactly

MelissaMM: I agree

NancyMD: Could this site be helpful for parents as well

KaitlynS: Yes!

NancyMD: I have an autistic nephew and I believe this will be useful for me, his family, and his teachers.

KaitlynS: Great!

KaitlynS: I see many of you are in the elementary field. A great resource for finding books and extension activities is planetesme.com

KaitlynS: If you are training to be a teacher, her book Diary of a Teacher's First Year is a

must!

KaitlynS: Her How to Get your Child to Love Reading is also a resource I have used loads!

KaitlynS: She is very "whole language" with her approach to teaching reading.

KaitlynS: click on the link and then click on the yellow go to planet esme now

KaitlynS: It's on the left in the green column

KaitlynS: She has all her books organized into holidays, events, topics, etc.

KaitlynS: Super! Thanks:)

KaitlynS: ok

BjB: I don't think Esme participated, but there is some good stuff there

KaitlynS: I have a mac... how do I copy and paste the link?

BjB: go to Actions and send to pasteboard

KaitlynS: ok

BjB: then copy the link and paste to another browser window

KaitlynS: Thanks

KaitlynS: For some reason, my husband thinks I should have a Mac, but that's another discussion

KaitlynS: ha

BjB: I'm not particular...as long as it works!

KaitlynS: In the UK, a great source that I've just been introduced to is

KaitlynS: great ICT resources

BjB agrees

KaitlynS: For our kids who need that constant repetition, this has definitely kept their interest!

KaitlynS: If you put it up on the Smart Board, it's also great for fine motor skills as well.

KaitlynS: To teach whole group

MelissaMM: wow looks like something my class would enjoy

KaitlynS: Have you used Starfall.com Melissa?

KaitlynS: My six-year-olds' favorite by far

MelissaMM: yes, my mentor teacher uses it in her 1st grade class

KaitlynS: Do you have any websites we haven't shared that you find are quite useful?

BjB: I liked the info for new teachers, Kaitlyn. I'm going to post that in the Teachers in Training group room

KaitlynS: Excellent Thanks:)

MelissaMM: unfortunately no, I have only seen starfall used in the school I'm at.

KaitlynS: no worries

KaitlynS: 4teachers.org is quite good

KaitlynS: Jeff- were you saying this website charges now?

KaitlynS: I used it last year when I had middle school.

BjB: Here's a site for first year teachers...has a review of Harry Wong's book, The First Days of School

BjB: http://www.glavac.com/harrywong.htm

KaitlynS: Thanks

BjB: rule two is perfect: 2. Here's the biggest secret to being effective: beg, borrow, and steal - and work collaboratively.

KaitlynS: oh defintitely

KaitlynS: I learned that the hard way.

NancyMD: I am learning that now

BjB: Tapped In was created to provide more opportunities for that collaboration

KaitlynS: You only have to be a hero some of the time. Teaching is all about NOT recreating the wheel

MelissaMM: true

KaitlynS: I have been teaching for six years and remember vividly in the interviews they wanted to know where and how I found resources.

MelissaMM: Oh really, that's something that none of our teachers who are preparing us for interviews have said

MelissaMM: good to know

BjB: regular newsletters home to parents is a good way to drum up some resources

NancyMD: I'll make sure to keep that in mind for my interviews

BjB: some teachers are even "selling" sponsorships for test papers

KaitlynS: I think that many schools are taking the shift to be very school-wide with everyone on the same page.

KaitlynS: What states will you be interviewing in?

MelissaMM: Texas

NancyMD: I'll be in Texas as well

KaitlynS: Through my experience, there are several schools using school-wide behavior and academic plans. Showing you can collaborate and be a true team is definitely something to make known.

MelissaMM: yeah, we do have school-wide behavior and academic plans

NancyMD: The schools have been in value team work highly

KaitlynS: BJ or Jeff Can you recommend any Discussions that would be beneficial to attend here in Tapped In

BjB: K to 3+ Resources

BjB . o O (great for early childhood)

KaitlynS: My school district gives me minimal points, but points for turning in my transcript from certain discussions

KaitlynS: Looking on calendar

NancyMD: Great! I was planning on attending that chat

BjB: and Teachers in Training is a nice support group for new and first year teachers who find that real life isn't quite like student teaching;-)

KaitlynS: I wish I had found Tapped In sooner.

MelissaMM: I will make sure to look into those discussions. thanks
